Lakes 3 have been working really hard in their phonics sessions, they have been looking at the 'm', 'a', 's', 't' and 'd' sounds.





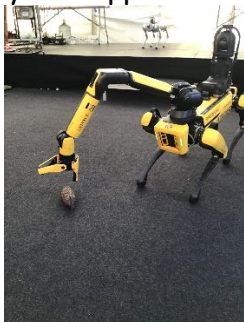
