on the pots

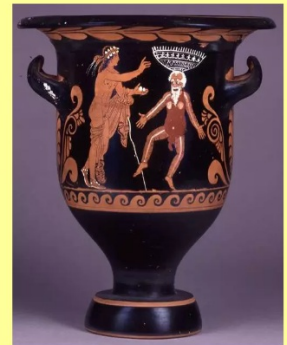
They had servants

for clothes



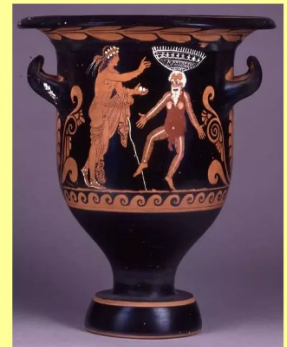
