

### Copy


Select colours and add to your portrait to create a mood or atmosphere.





Characteristics of Van Gogh's work:


Use of dark outlines

and things).





















## Create a Van Gogh inspired self portrait



### Complete these tasks

Task 1: Collect a pencil, rubber, ruler and 4 coloured pencils.

Task 2: Create your own self portrait in the style of Van Gogh self portraits. (Add colour and lines to recreate his impressionist styled portrait). See following slides to help guide you.



### You are going to draw a self portrait using skills and understanding you have learnt

Your aim is to try and use the skills you have learnt to create your best drawing yet.


My biggest ask is that you don't simply just try to get it done, but try it to the best of your ability. If that means it takes you quite a while then do just that.

If you need to pause the video or watch it again then please do.

'If it didn't stick in your mind, it's time to rewind'




- A small mark for top/ bottom/ left and right hand side of your face.
- Draw an oval shape making sure the bottom is smaller than the top.
- Draw a line going across the centre.
- Draw a line going down the centre.






- Measure across the eye line and divide the whole number by 4.
- Start with the line going down the centre of the portrait and mark (with a dot) that ¼ measurement over the centre line.
- Draw a mark in either side of the dots where the ¼ measurement is.






- A mark half way between the eye line and the chin.
- Draw a mark half way between the nose and chin.
- Drop a line from the inside corner of each eye (this is the nose width).





- Draw the shape of your hairstyle
- Make sure hair goes above the top line of your original oval shape.
- The fringe or hairline should be drawn well below the top line of your original shape.





- Choose 3 colours that reflect your mood.
- Add a light base trying to follow contour lines of your face.
- Add the other 2 colours in small broken lines.
- Outline with a darker colour.
- Add a background in the style of Van Gogh.
