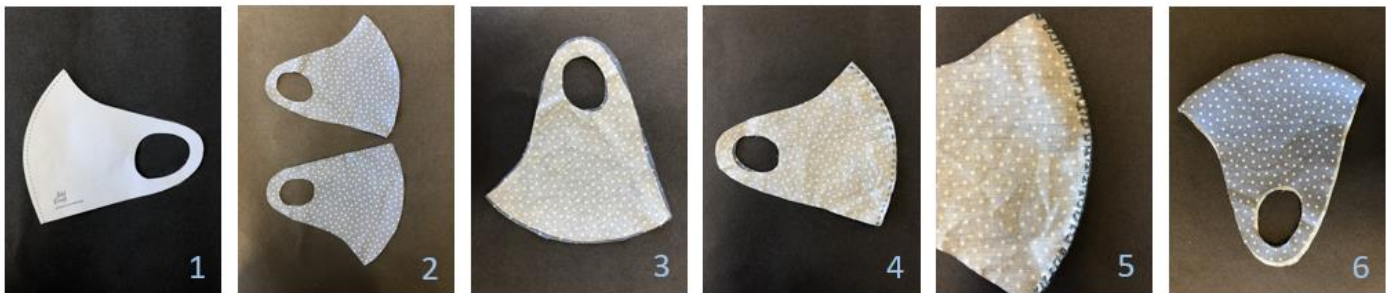

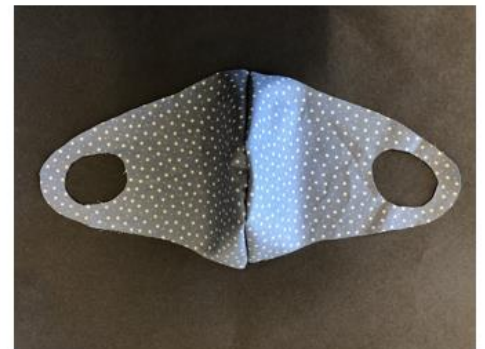
### Steps to creating a face mask design 1:

Note: This design works best with stretchy fabric



#### Steps

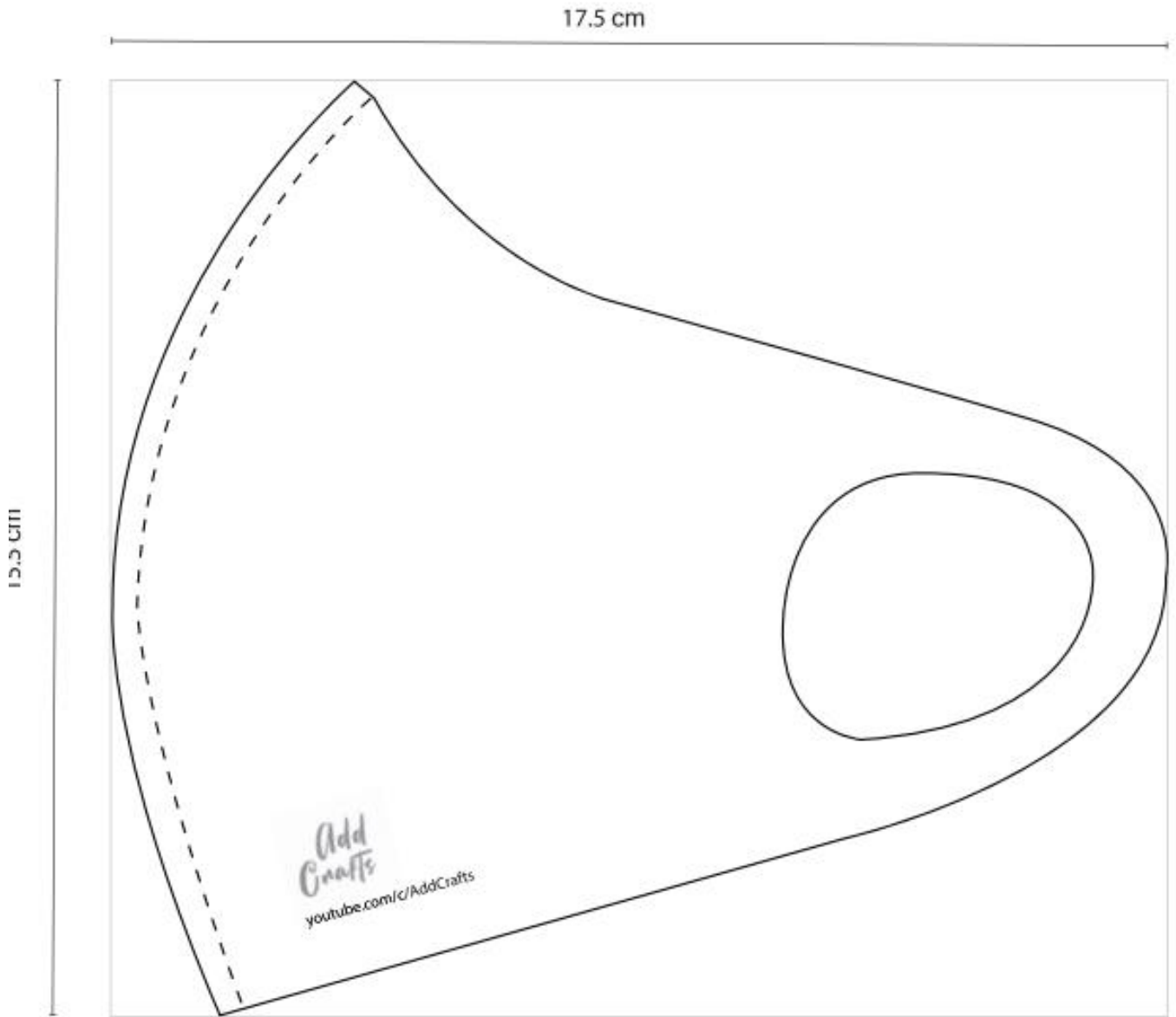
1. Cut out the stencil template
2. Draw around the template onto your chosen fabric, flipping the template when you cut the second template.
3. Cut out both designs carefully placing the side of the fabric that you want to see at the end on the exterior together.
4. After pinning the fabric together complete a running stitch along the edge.
5. Go over the running stitch with a blanket stitch.
6. Turn the fabric the right way round and it is completed.
