### English Language 1

| Q. | Skill                       | How to write answer                                 |
|----|-----------------------------|---|
| 1  | Reading – find facts        | Bullet points either summary or quote from the text |
| 2  | Reading – language analysis | PEEEL based on short extract                        |
| 3  | Reading – structure         | PEEEL   |
| 4  | Reading – giving opinion    | PEEEL   |
| 5  | Writing – descriptive       | Description or story                                |

### English Language 2

| Q. | Skill                           | How to write answer  |
|----|---------------------------------|--|
| 1  | Reading – find facts            | Tick the boxes   |
| 2  | Reading – summary               | Paragraphs with small quotations embedded                                      |
| 3  | Reading – language analysis     | PEEEL  |
| 4  | Reading – comparing perspective | PEEEL comparison   |
| 5  | Writing – rhetorical            | Specified form: newspaper article, magazine article, speech/talk, diary, essay |

### English Literature 1

| Q. | Skill  | How to write answer                |
|----|--|------------------------------------|
| 1  | Shakespeare (Macbeth or R+J)                                       | PEEEL – use extract and own quotes |
| 2  | Novel (A Christmas Carol, The Sign of the Four or Jekyll and Hyde) | PEEEL – use extract and own quotes |

### English Literature 2

| Q. | Skill   | How to write answer  |
|----|---|--|
| 1  | Play (An Inspector Calls or Blood Brothers)           | PEEEL – no extract   |
| 2  | Poetry (Power and Conflict or Love and Relationships) | PEEEL – comparison of two poems, one printed, one you know |
| 3  | Unseen Poem   | PEEEL – TWISTED  |
| 4  | Unseen Poem #2  | PEEEL – comparison of both unseen poems                    |
