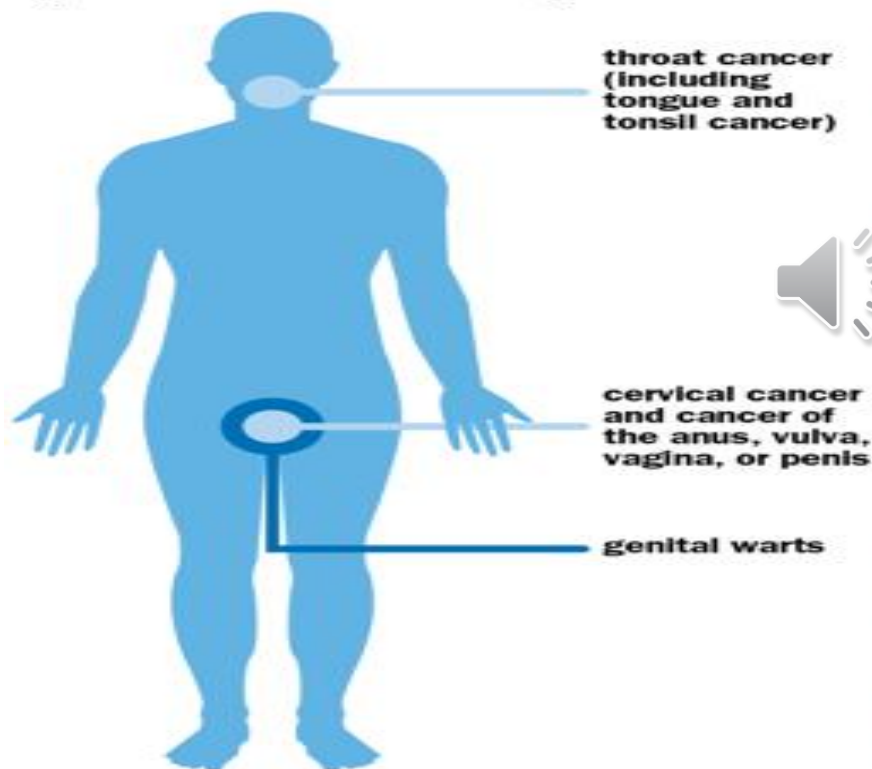

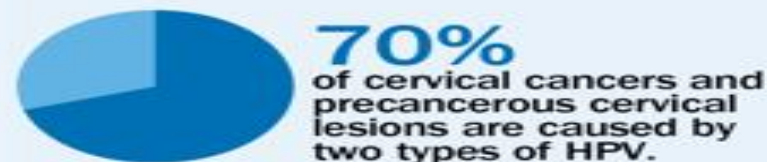


How an HPV infection can affect your body

There are more than 100 types of HPV. At least 13 types cause cancer, and two types are associated with genital warts.



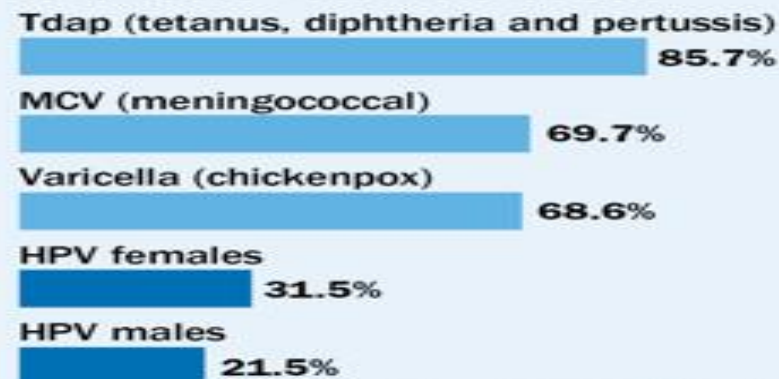

The HPV vaccine is safe. There are only **1.7 cases per 1 million doses** of a severe allergic reaction.

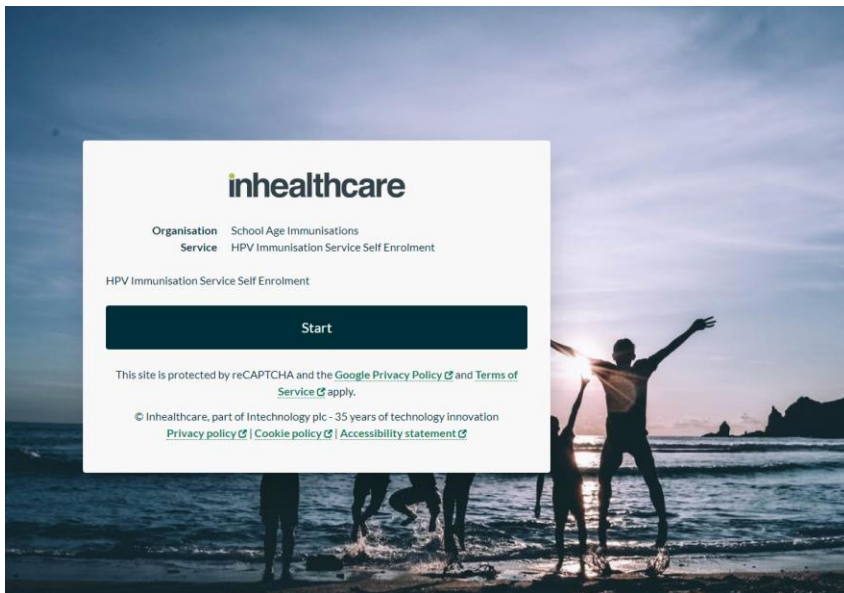


Consent

vaccination session.

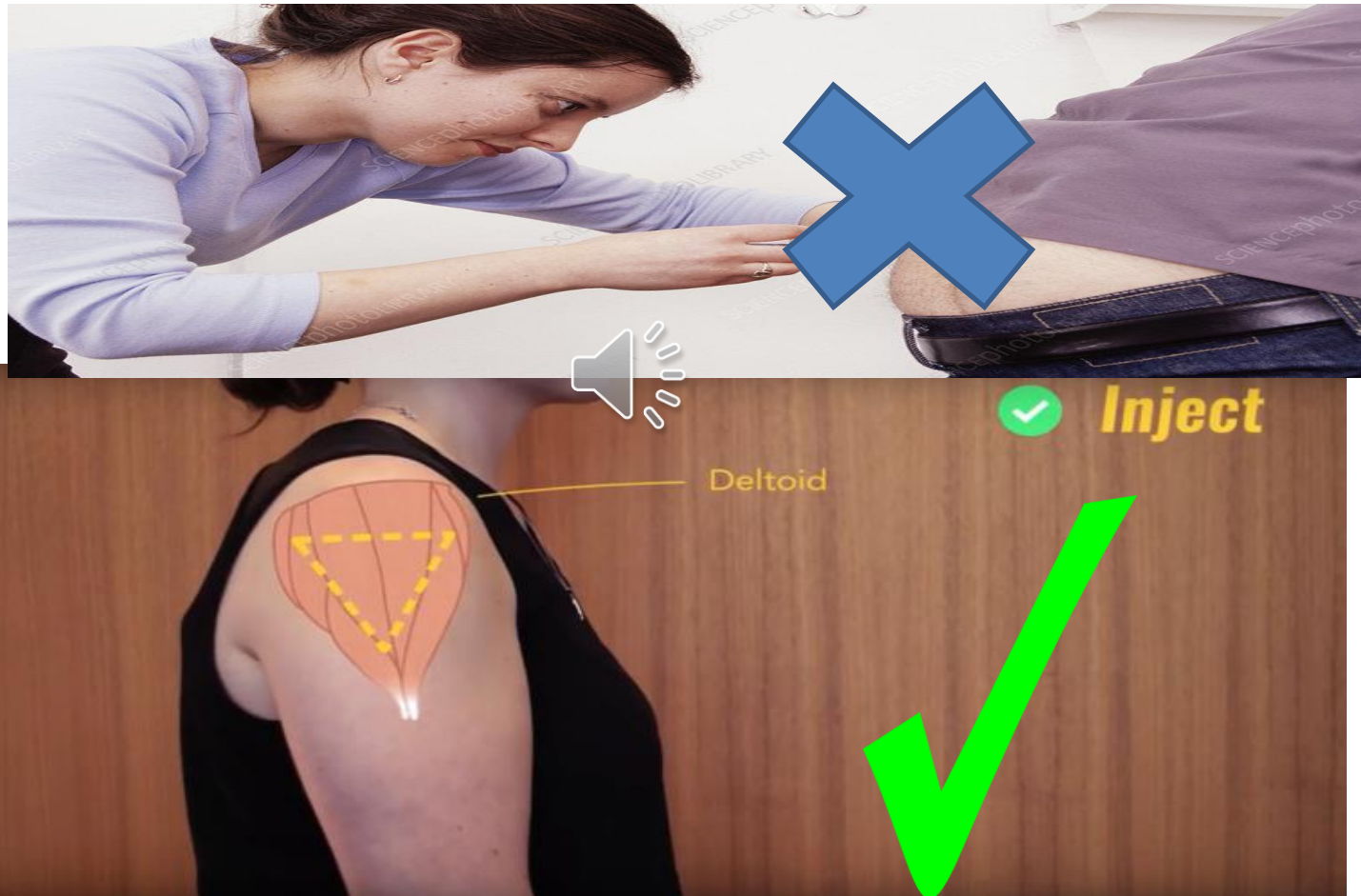
If your parents/carers are not sure you should
