HT Message

Over the course of this week, we have had a further four staff test positively for COVID 19. Several of these work within the Year 5 'bubble' and were confirmed last weekend. Also, we have had another positive case with a pupil in Year 5. Consequently, following PHE advice, we have taken the decision to extend the self-isolation period for all year 5 pupils and staff until Friday 27th November. Those in self isolation can come out of quarantine on Saturday 28th November and should return to school on Monday 30th November. This information was communicated to families earlier in the week via the SIMS Parent App.

At the time of writing this message, the rate of infection within the school appears to be slowing and we hope that by moving quickly to identify 'close contacts' and ask for them to isolate, we will reduce the likelihood of this infection spreading more widely across the school.

I am deeply grateful to all families that have supported us by informing us of positive cases and going into self-isolation. I do not underestimate the pressure this puts on parents and carers, but this is the only way to combat this most contagious of viruses.

Following a successful week of live teaching, I can confirm that the offer for Year 5 parents next week will be four hours of 'live teaching' daily.
