HT Message

You may be aware that, earlier this week, pupils in Year 7, 8, 9 and 10 were moved onto a rota system. I appreciate a number of parents, carers and pupils who will have some questions about this. Therefore, please find some FAQs for the Senior Section rota:

If my child has been asked to undertake home learning, will this impact their attendance?

No, periods of home learning are marked with a code which is considered an authorised off-site activity and their overall attendance figures will not be negatively impacted. This is also true for children who have been asked to self-isolate.

What work will be set for them whilst they are learning from home?

Pupils working from home will receive 'live teaching' via MS Teams. Staff will start sessions according to a published timetable which is shared with parents via the SIMS Parent App. Typically, they have at least three 'live sessions' per day.

How long will the rota last for?

During the Summer Term we explored a number of options for Senior Section pupils to undertake some home learning if needed. The current rota system was one of the models we developed and is designed to be used for short periods during times when a significant number of staff are asked to self-isolate. Regular assessments of staffing levels are made, which informs us as to how long we must run the rota for. Please rest assured, we will only run a rota for the minimum time possible.

My child cannot access home learning since they do not have the right hardware or software, what do I do?

Our home learning offer has been designed to run on either a smart phone or laptop via MS Teams. The school has purchased a number of devices which can be lent out to families. Please email Mrs. Erika Anders, SENCo, for details on:

How can I help my child with home learning?

Please do try and establish a 'normal' routine with the usual wake up time, breakfast etc. Individual timetables are sent out to families via SIMS Parent App, so you know when your child has a 'live lesson' and when they have a break.

How can I access SIMS Parent App?

What will the rota be next week?

Monday 30th November Year 10 should not come to school and must access learning from home Tuesday 1st December Year 9 should not come to school and must access learning from home Wednesday 2nd December Year 8 should not come to school and must access learning from home

Based on the current staffing position, we believe that we can finish this rota on Wednesday 2nd December and return to normal from Thursday 3rd December. Please note, however, that this is subject to change and, if we see a significant number of staff being required to self-isolate, we may need to move back onto a rota at a future date. We will, of course, inform you via the SIMS Parent App, at the earliest opportunity if this is the case.

Why has the Senior Section moved to a rota?

Infection rates at the school remain very low. Since September we have had nine staff (around 6% of the total) and fourteen pupils (around 1% of the total) with confirmed cases of COVID 19. However, a significant number of staff have been asked to self-isolate either through the NHS Track and Trace App or as an identified 'close contact' by the school on the advice of PHE.

Additionally, by moving to a rota, we reduce the need for external supply teachers and therefore, further limit the number of people coming into the building – helping to stop the spread.

Will the Primary Section move to a rota?

Our expectation is that this will not need to happen. Should a positive case of COVID 19 be reported within a Primary Section class, then our approach will be to ask all members of the class to self-isolate and move directly into daily 'live teaching' with their class teacher. In cases where the class teacher is unwell, then provision will be made for an experienced colleague to run the sessions until such a time that the normal class teacher is available.

Is there any provision for vulnerable or key worker children for the day my child is due to learn from home?
