Despite a logistically demanding week, I am very pleased to report that the atmosphere around the school is very focussed and calm. We have now completed the first of three LFT for eligible pupils in Years 6 to 11 and can report that we have had no positive nor void results i.e. The test was not conducted properly. Please be aware that following each test, pupils will be issued with an NHS Track and Trace registration card with their individual bar code. Please use this to log your child's details and to receive notifications.

We have now commenced the second of three onsite tests and the remaining dates for the final LFT are shown below. As ever, we will only contact you if the result is positive:

Whilst the above exercise should give us some comfort, I would like to remind pupils, parents and carers that whilst these tests are reliable, like any prognostic test, they are not 100% accurate. Consequently, the LFT should be seen as **one of a variety of steps** that we need to take to keep the COVID virus at bay. Consequently, if your child is showing any symptoms of COVID:

- high temperature
- new, continuous cough
- loss of, or change to, your sense of smell or taste

then you must **not send them to school** and should order a home test using the link below:

Also, it is imperative that all pupils observe the usual hygiene steps, which, by now are familiar:

- Space keep your distance whenever possible;
- Face Use a face covering when required inside the school building;
- Hands regularly wash your hands using soap and hot water or a hand sanitiser.

Every classroom has a supply of tissues so that children can practice the "catch it, bin it, kill it" mantra.

From Tuesday 16th March, we will begin to issue pupils in our Senior Section with a home testing kit. Please ensure that these tests are taken according to the following pattern:

Victory and Discovery House (yellow or red tie) on a Monday and Thursday Intrepid and Endeavour House (green or blue tie) on a Tuesday and Friday

Parents and carers will need to upload their children's test results to the NHS Track and Trace website using the instructions in the pack **and** also inform the school as we are required to keep our own register for these tests. Parents can do this in one of three ways:

If your child's home test results are **positive**, then please ring the school immediately on 02392 693432. Outside school hours, please email <u>stedmanm@mayfield.portsmouth.sch.uk</u> We will then make contact with you to explain the next steps.

It is an absolute pleasure to have the whole Senior section back in school this week. All the pupils that came in for their Lateral Flow Test were very responsible and although we had some nervous children they really did make us proud.

The gates for entering the school in the morning have changed from before Christmas- Year 7 and Year 11 now enter through the brown gates off Inhurst Road and Years 8, 9 and 10 enter through the gate on Hewett Road by the Tennis courts. It is important that Years 7 and 8 are through their gate by

Head of Primary (Mrs Fiona Rogers)

It has been absolutely amazing to welcome back the whole of Primary this week. So many cheerful faces coming through the gates in the morning have really cheered us all up. The first week back has been very settled and there has been a lovely atmosphere of learning across the Primary section.

Thank you to those of you who have been ready for school by arriving in your full school uniform and remembering to bring in their PE kit. I am aware that several year 3 pupil PE kits have been misplaced over the lockdown. Please contact your child's teacher in the first instance if this applies to you. In the meantime, if you do not have a PE kit or are awaiting an order, please send in a black t-shirt or a t-shirt in your child's house colour so that they can still participate in PE.

This week we have spent some time talking to pupils about "Beeing Kind" to one another. We have asked pupils to remember to use kind words and kind hands, especially in the playground. Please make sure that you talk to your child about the importance of this if you can.

Extra-curricular clubs are currently taking place for those who need after school care. Whilst the behaviour of children in clubs is usually exemplary, there are a number of pupils who have not behaved in a respectful way to staff. This is not acceptable and parents will be informed of any incidents when they take place. If your child receives three warnings regarding their behaviour, it may be the case that they can no longer attend and will need to go to early tea club instead for which a charge is applicable.

Red Nose Day 2021 takes place on Friday 19th March. In a slight change to the bulletin last week, a limited amount of red noses can be purchased for £1.50 via ScoPay up until Thursday and will be delivered to children in class on Friday. It is important that noses are not shared with others during the school day. Whilst we are not having a non-school uniform day this year, we will still be having some comic relief! On Monday pupils will have an assembly where the red nose joke competition will be launched. All pupils can enter their favourite joke for an entry fee of 50p. Anyone who wishes to enter can do so by writing their joke on a red nose template and handing it to their teacher with 50p attached. This money will be quarantined for at least 72 hours before being counted and a total shared with pupils. Pupils can enter as many times as they like for 50p per go, but entries must be in by Wednesday. Please keep an eye on your SIMS parent app for more details.

Finally, please can I ask that parents conduct themselves in an appropriate manner when dropping of and picking up their children. There have been a number of incidents recently where other parents and staff have been verbally abused and foul language has been used in front of children. this is unacceptable and will not be tolerated. We will look to make other arrangements for drop off and pick up if parents cannot adhere to this. Thank you in advance for your support with this.

Head of Pre-school and Nursery

Unfortunately, we still seem to be having problems with school uniform. Can you please clearly label every item to prevent cardigans or jumpers going home with the wrong child by mistake.

Our topic will continue with the theme 'Dinosaurs' - in class we shall discuss the role of a Palaeontologist introducing vocabulary extinct, excavation, herbivore, carnivore and names of dinosaurs that the children are not familiar with. The children will be taking part in a dinosaur dig. They will carefully excavate bones hidden in the sand, sort the bones by size, shape and labelling what they find.

Learning intentions linked to class subject:

- Promoting mark making to record findings;
- Sort the dinosaurs by eating habits, Carnivore, Herbivore or Omnivore;
- Mathematics create a dinosaur using 2d shapes.

Letter sound of the week is 'T'. The children really enjoy sharing thier work at circle time with their peers. The teachers use their work to promote the speech sound.
