You will be aware that the Government have stated that details around the planned full reopening of schools will be shared during the week beginning 22nd February. At this time, I would ask that families take a moment over the half term break to ensure your child has all the necessary uniform and including **'black polishable'** shoes, and for pupils in the Senior Section, an essential equipment pack:

- Black pen and pencil plus spares;
- Purple pen for feedback;
- Glue stick;
- 30cm Ruler and an eraser;
- CASIO Fx Series calculator;
- Face covering plus spare;
- Water bottle;
- Reading book (Year 7 and 8 only).

Please note that the 'Friends of Mayfield' operate a pre-loved uniform shop selling inexpensive, clean, good quality items of uniform. As part of your 'daily exercise', please feel free to drop into our Main Reception between 8:00am and 3:00pm to see what is available!

In line with the DfE's guidance, Mayfield will be fully closed to all pupils including those of 'critical workers' and children considered 'vulnerable' during the half term break. However, we are required by the Government to keep tracking and tracing 'close contacts' of positive cases within our school community over the half-term holidays. This is because, if your child tests positive for COVID 19 over the holidays, it is likely that they will have been infectious in school for the final days of the half-term and therefore we will need to advise all children who are 'close contacts' to self-isolate.

Therefore, it is important that we are informed of any pupils who have been attending our in-school provision who return a positive test in the half-term holidays. This can be reported to the school by:
