# <u>Covid Vaccination Mop up sessions following vaccination day at Mayfield School on Thursday 21st</u> October 2021

Following the above vaccination day, the immunisation team are now providing details of the mop up sessions for those young people who, for one reason or another have not been able to have their covid vaccination but who still wish to do so. Dedicated 12-15 year old clinics have been made available in our mass vaccination centres in Portsmouth and this will replace the need for further sessions in school.

The National Booking System has been adapted for use for this cohort of young people and will be made live very shortly.

A letter for parents, a parental information pack and a consent form can be found <u>here</u>, this will also include the national booking link for parents to access and make their appointment directly.

Please remember that at the current time unless the child is classed as clinically vulnerable, they only require 1 dose of the vaccine.

Someone with parental responsibility will be required to accompany the young person for their vaccination and parents / carers will be required to bring the completed consent form with them to their appointment – this is indicated in the attached letter.

# **Covid Testing Over Half-term**

NHS Test and Trace have asked us to share this message with you

Thank you for your continued support with Covid-19 home testing. **We know how important it is for you to be able to send your children to school.** 

You should encourage your children to continue testing and <u>report</u> results twice a week, at home, throughout the October half-term school holiday and take a test before returning to school on Sunday evening or Monday morning. All results should be reported, even if your result is negative or void.

Your children can collect extra home test kits from Pupil Services and bring them home with them. You can help them to take the test and report their results. Testing is free of charge. If you do still require more home testing kits to continue testing over half term, you can also order more online through gov.uk or collect from your local pharmacy.

By testing your child twice a week over half term, you will help us to reduce transmission of Coronavirus, keep your child in school and Mayfield open to minimise disruption to their education and to you and your household.

#### Free School Meal Voucher for October half-term

Families who are entitled to Free School Meals should have received vouchers to the value of £15 per eligible child this week. The vouchers will come through the Edenred Portal and must then be redeemed before they can be spent at all major supermarkets. This scheme is funded by Portsmouth City Council and these vouchers will only work on this website:



**Year 1** have worked extremely hard this half term as they have immersed themselves into new routines.

To end their half term, they have been making predictions and writing dictated sentences using capital letters, finger spaces and full stops. They have also been focusing on addition fact families, understanding how numbers can be swapped around in number sentences.

This week they have enjoyed using autumn leaves to create a selection of art pieces. The year 1 topic next half term is 'Everyday Heroes'. You should have received a letter to provide you with information about "our heroes day" taking place on Wednesday 3rd November.

Please can we ask you to ensure your child brings a coat to school as we will be completing lots of

outdoor learning.



**Year 2** had an enjoyable Tuesday learning all about bread as a symbol for Christians and Jews. It was lovely to see so many parents able to join us for our dinosaur pasta activity and have an opportunity to look at some of the learning we have been doing. **Year 3** have had a very exciting week this week. They practiced their charcoal skills before creating some authentic cave drawings. They used their knowledge of shade to help this look amazing. On Thursday afternoon, they shared all of their Stone Age learning with year 1-6. They shared their art, non-chronological reports and our creations from Butser.



**Year 4** have had another amazing week to end a fantastic half term. They have shown very responsible attitudes to their learning all term and always work incredibly hard. We hope that you are as proud of them as we are.

#### A few things to remember:

Next payment for Minstead - Friday 5th November

Please continue supporting your child with schoolwork during half term especially reading, spelling and times tables.

In **Year 5**, pupils have been writing settings descriptions. This has allowed them to be descriptive and creative in their writing. They have learnt skills including alliteration and expanded noun phrases.

In Maths, pupils have practiced using times table grids to allow them to become more efficient in their weekly times table test!

**Year 6** have had a fantastic last week of the half term, completing their topic on Ancient Greeks. The children have sketched images of the Minotaur, applying their skills from previous lessons and enjoyed publishing their recounts of Virgo's day at Elliott's school, from Who Let the Gods Out. In Maths, the children have explored negative numbers looking at different contexts and using strategies for calculation.

After half term we will be looking for three monitors from each class who will be responsible for ensuring that corridors are clear and tidy so that their class can be in with a chance of winning the

corridor cup each week. If your child would like to apply, they should write a letter to their teacher and hand it in by the first Wednesday back after half term.

On the first 4 Monday's back after half term, our year 6 staff and a number of pupils will be taking part in some training in Proactive Sharing Circles. These interventions are designed to support pupils as part of our Monday "Check In" and will be rolled out across the whole of Primary over a period of time. This training has already happened successfully in the Senior section and the feedback so far has been very positive. Letters for the initial group of pupils taking part in the training have been given out today.

Please remember that the summer uniform of Mayfield shorts and dress may no longer be worn after half term so please ensure that pupils are in trousers or a Mayfield skirt from the first day back.

Final message to parents regarding the Minstead visit after half term:
