You will be aware that the DfE has now shared their plans for the full reopening of schools. Primary Section pupils will return on Monday 8th March at the normal times. However, the Government has asked that Senior Section pupils only return once they have taken a Lateral Flow Test (LFT) and the result is negative.

I am pleased to share with you that, to date, over 750 families within our Senior Section have already completed the registration process for LFT. If you have not yet done this, then please do so urgently and before 4:00pm on 5th March using the following form:

Taking a LFT is optional. However, we **strongly** urge all parents, carers and pupils to take one since this will give a level of reassurance to other pupils, their families and our staff. If you do not wish your child to participate in the LFT process, you will still need to complete the above form, and answer 'no' to the question 'do you give permission for your child to take a LFT?'. LFTs are only approved for use by children over the age of 11. Therefore, the vast majority of Primary children are not able to take part in this programme. However, as an All-through School, we are able to offer Year 6 pupils who have had their 11th birthday the opportunity to take part. Further details on how Year 6 can access this programme will be sent out via the SIMS App next week.

Once the above form has been submitted, then pupils in Years 7 to 11 should follow the staggered timetable below to undertake their LFT and start face to face teaching:

Pupils should enter the building via the Main Reception at their allocated testing time and staff will be on hand to welcome them and explain the process. The testing process takes around 45 minutes. We will supervise children on site until such time their test result is available.

Years 7 pupils who return a negative test result will start their face-to-face lessons following their normal timetable immediately.

In the event of a positive test result, we will contact parents or carers and the pupil will be sent home to begin an immediate period of self-isolation – further support will be offered in this case.

Keeping your child safe

Please rest assured that we have reviewed and further developed our internal protection processes in line with the latest Government Guidance. A copy of our risk assessment can be found here.

Please note that during the LFT process outlined above, pupils will be required to observe stringent social distancing and use a face covering at all time. Hand sanitation facilities will be available.

Face Coverings

The Government has updated their guidance around Face Coverings for pupils in our Senior Section. Therefore, until further notice, we require all senior section pupils to wear a face covering when:

- they arrive to and leave the school site;
- inside the building and moving around the school in corridors and communal areas where social distancing cannot easily be maintained;
- in classrooms or during activities unless social distancing can be maintained.

The above does not apply in situations where wearing a face covering would impact on the ability to take part in exercise or strenuous activity, for example in PE, Dance or Drama lessons.

Children in our Primary Section should not wear a face covering.

We recognise that some pupils will not be able to wear a face mask for a variety of reasons. In these cases, we ask that parents and carers alert Mrs. Erika Anders, SENCo on:

She will discuss your child's particular circumstances and issue an 'exemption card' which pupils should show to staff on request. If your child has already been issued with an exemption, then they do not need to re-apply.

Please note that in cases where any pupil refuses to wear a face covering, without good reason or exemption, then sanctions will be applied, and alternative educational provision could be made for them.

Uniform and dress code

With the imminent return to school, we ask that parents and carers take some time to check your child's uniform and accessories are all in order. We know that the consistent application of a uniform policy best supports children and helps them prepare and adjust for school – this has never been more true. Equally, we appreciate these are exceptional times and therefore if you are facing particularly challenging financial circumstances, Mrs. Erika Anders is available to provide discrete and confidential help. Please note that the 'Friends of Mayfield' operate a pre-loved uniform shop selling inexpensive, clean, good quality items of uniform. As part of your 'daily exercise,' please feel free to drop into our Main Reception between 8:00am and 3:00pm to see what is available or indeed drop off any donations!

Equipment

We will continue to provide all Primary Section pupils with individual stationery packs to minimise the sharing of equipment. We ask that all pupils in our Senior Section carry the following:

- Black pen and pencil plus spares;
- Purple pen for feedback;
- Glue stick;
- 30cm Ruler and an eraser;
- CASIO Fx Series calculator;
- Face covering plus spares;
- Water bottle;
- Reading book (Year 7 and 8 only).

Remote learning and laptops

Remote learning will terminate in its current form on:

Friday 5th March for children in Years R to 6 with a return to school on Monday 8th March Monday 8th March for pupils in Years 10 and 11 with a return to school on Tuesday 9th March Tuesday 9th March for pupils in Years 7, 8 and 9 with a return to school on Wednesday 10th March

In cases where children are asked to self-isolate due to a positive LFT or similar, or as part of our 'track and trace' process, then we will continue to offer remote learning opportunities where work will be available on the school's website for pupils to complete, if they are well enough.

If your child has been issued with a school laptop, or other equipment, then we ask that parents return this to the school's Main Reception by 31st March including any power cables, cases, or accessories. Please note, all laptops will be wiped of personal data and reissued as required.

Extra-Curricular Clubs - Primary

Our extra-curricular provision will restart on Monday 8th March for children within our Primary Section. However, in line with Government Guidance, these will operate differently until further notice. Clubs will:

- where possible, be based around 'class bubbles';
- focus on developing reading, writing, speaking and motor skills.

We are very sorry that we have had to limit the range of activities offered, and hope that our normal extensive provision will be up and running very soon. Please note that all parents and carers will need to rebook as we have had to wipe the original bookings. To book your child into an extra-curricular club, then please use the online booking system which opens at 6:00pm on:

Extended School Day - Year 4, 5 and 6

In order to begin to address some of the lost learning due to lockdowns, we intend to roll out our programme of extending the school day from Monday 8th March. We will be running curriculum PE lessons for Year 4, 5 and 6 every week between 3:30pm and 4:30pm:

Monday – Year 6 Wednesday – Year 5 Thursday – Year 4 Please ensure that all children have their PE kit with them. Children in these year groups will not be able to book into extra curricular clubs on these days.

Extra-Curricular Clubs - Seniors

Extra-Curricular clubs for seniors will begin after Easter.

Breakfast Club

Our usual Breakfast Club will restart from Monday 8th March for Primary Section children. It runs from 7:45am to 8:45am and children are offered a choice of fruit, cereal, toast and jam or brioche. Each session costs £4.50 and is bookable via Scopay.

Teatime Club

The Teatime Club provides a place for children to do their homework, play games or unwind after school. The club runs between 3:30pm and 6:00pm and children are offered a light tea such as sandwiches, yoghurts, and fruit. There are two options:

- Early Teatime Club runs from 3:30pm and costs £9 per session;
- Late Teatime Club runs from 4:30pm and costs £8 per session.

Children attending the Late Teatime Club are walked there by staff after their extra-curricular club has finished. Teatime Clubs finish at 6:00pm and are bookable via Scopay.

<u>INSET Days 2020 – 2021</u>

I can confirm that the remaining INSET days will now take place on Wednesday 21st July, Thursday 22nd July, and Friday 23rd July. This means that the last day for pupils to attend school during the Summer Term will be Tuesday 20th July. Staff will use this time to decant from the current building to our new school, ready for a September opening.

Senior Section Catering Accounts

The accounts for Senior Section catering have moved over to the Scopay system and Senior section parents should now top up their children's lunch accounts through Scopay. This is the same system that is used for Primary lunches and payments for school trips, uniform and equipment across the school. Any balances that parents had in Parentpay before Christmas should now been have transferred to your child's Scopay account. Parentpay is no longer used at Mayfield.

Free School Meals

The DfE Free School Meals voucher scheme closes at the end of next week. On Monday 1st March, eligible families will be sent a voucher based on the attendance to school in w/b 22nd February. The vouchers for attendance to school in w/b 1st March will be processed on Friday 5th March.
