HT Message – Mr. David Jeapes

I can confirm that, in line with the DfE's guidance, Mayfield will be fully closed to all pupils including those of 'critical workers' and children considered 'vulnerable' during the half term break. However, we are required by the Government to keep tracking and tracing 'close contacts' of positive cases within our school community over the half-term holidays. This is because, if your child tests positive for COVID 19 over the holidays, it is likely that they will have been infectious in school for the final days of the half-term and therefore we will need to advise all children who are 'close contacts' to self-isolate.

Therefore, it is important that we are informed of any pupils who have been attending our in-school provision who return a positive test in the half-term holidays. This can be reported to the school by:

- emailing the school on General@mayfield.portsmouth.sch.uk or
- telephone the school on 02392 693432 and choose extension 236 to leave a message on our absence reporting line.

Staff members will then begin to identify any 'close contacts' and communicate with relevant families. If your child does show symptoms of COVID, then you should book a test using the link below:

We have received the following advice from the DfE around the Prime Minister's announcement:

"it will not be possible to resume face-to-face learning immediately after the February half-term and instead (he) hopes it will be safe to commence the re-opening of schools and colleges from Monday 8 March. This is in response to the national public health data and pressure on NHS capacity.

If the Government achieves its target of vaccinating everyone in the four most vulnerable groups with their first dose by 15 February then those groups will have developed immunity from the virus around three weeks later, that is by 8 March. It is for this reason that we hope it will therefore be safe to commence the reopening of schools from Monday 8 March.

In response to the above, we will continue to offer remote learning and onsite provisions as we have done throughout the Spring 1 half term until at least Friday 5th March. When a final decision is made around the school fully reopening, we will, of course, communicate this with you at the earliest opportunity, including our plans for running extracurricular activities.

INSET Days 2020 - 2021

Given the significant disruption that we have all endured, we have taken the decision to postpone our planned INSET day on Friday 12th February. Therefore, on this day, remote and onsite provisions will continue as normal. I can confirm that the remaining INSET days will now take place on Wednesday 21st July, Thursday 22nd July, and Friday 23rd July. This means that the last day for pupils to attend school during the Summer Term will be Tuesday 20th July. Staff will use this time to decant from the current building to our new school, ready for a September opening.

Head of Pre-school and Nursery
