<u>Covid Vaccination Mop up sessions following vaccination day at Mayfield School on Thursday 21st</u> October 2021

Following the above vaccination day, the immunisation team are now providing details of the mop up sessions for those young people who, for one reason or another have not been able to have their covid vaccination but who still wish to do so. Dedicated 12-15 year old clinics have been made available in our mass vaccination centres in Portsmouth and this will replace the need for further sessions in school.

The National Booking System has been adapted for use for this cohort of young people and will be made live very shortly.

A letter for parents, a parental information pack and a consent form can be found <u>here</u>, this will also include the national booking link for parents to access and make their appointment directly.

Please remember that at the current time unless the child is classed as clinically vulnerable, they only require 1 dose of the vaccine.

Someone with parental responsibility will be required to accompany the young person for their vaccination and parents / carers will be required to bring the completed consent form with them to their appointment – this is indicated in the attached letter.

It was great to welcome everyone back this week. Autumn 2 is a very busy term for us and has started with the year 5 residential trip to Minstead. It sounds like the children have been having a wonderful time and have seen some amazing animals and learnt lots of new skills.

This week, Year R have been learning all about fireworks and their significance in different celebrations, such as Diwali and Bonfire Night. The children were discussing the importance of staying safe around fireworks and showed how responsible they can be when talking about fire safety. They were also very excited to have the opportunity to explore the fire engine that visited Mayfield and to talk to the firefighters about everything they had learned.

Year 1 had a great start to their half term as we kick started our topic with our 'Heroes Day'. It was brilliant to see so many wonderful costumes and for children to see such a range of heroes. We would like to thank parents/carers for their support with this. Children were very lucky to have special visitors who came in to talk to them about their job and why it was important. We also completed different activities throughout the day and reflected on how thankful we are for all these amazing heroes!











We look forward to continuing our topic and holding our parent event towards the end of half term!

In year 2 it has been lovely to see the children return and introduce them to our new topic for this half term - Healthy Me!! We have been looking at poems in English and making inferences as well as continuing this idea within our daily reading sessions.
