Covid Testing over the Summer Holidays and in September

The DfE have confirmed that there is no requirement for pupils to keep taking the twice weekly Lateral Flow Tests over the summer holiday period. We will be providing one further box of tests to pupils next week through tutor time. Your child may wish to keep taking the tests throughout the holidays for their own peace of mind and further supplies can be collected from a local pharmacy or ordered online from Order coronavirus (COVID-19) rapid lateral flow tests - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk).

The DfE have indicated that all senior section pupils including the new Year 7 should take two Covid tests on-site at school before they return in September. These tests need to be spaced 3-5 days apart. We will be in the new school buildings for this round of testing and further details about the dates and times for each tutor group's tests will be made available before the summer holidays.

After this, the requirement to take twice weekly lateral flow tests will resume until the end of September when the policy is to be reviewed.

Updated Covid Guidance for Schools for September

Revised Covid Guidance for Schools for September was published this week. Some of the main changes are:

- An end to the Bubble system. Assemblies can resume and children from different year groups can mix in playgrounds, at lunchtimes and in Extra-Curricular Clubs
- There will be no requirement for staff or adults to maintain social distancing in communal areas, offices and classrooms
- Schools will no longer need to carry out their own track and trace procedures. The NHS Track
 and Trace service will now work with families to identify the close contacts if a child tests
 positive
- Face coverings will no longer be advised for pupils, staff, parents or visitors in classrooms, communal areas or school minibuses
- Clinically extremely vulnerable pupils should attend school

Some important safety control measures will stay in place for the new academic year including:

- Maintaining a risk assessment that advises the school community on controlling the virus
- Ensuring good hygiene through regular washing and sanitizing of hands and the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach
- Keeping classrooms and office spaces well ventilated
- Following the current public health advice on self-isolation
- Having a contingency plan in the event of a localised outbreak that could mean reverting to remote education
