HT Message

You will be aware that we have seen a rise in positive cases of COVID 19 within our local and school community. I would like to address some of the FAQs we have had:

1. How many staff have tested positive in school?

Four staff, approximately 3% of our workforce, have tested positively for COVID. Two staff members work in different subject areas within our Senior Section and two in Year 5. We have closed Year 5 as a precautionary measure and classes should return as follows:

Caribbean Class on Friday 20th November Coral Class on Monday 23rd November Aegean Class on Monday 23rd November Caspian Class on Monday 23rd November

Equally, a number of Senior Section pupils have been asked to self-isolate, as a precautionary measure, having been identified as "close contacts" to a staff member or child that has tested positively.

2. How many pupils have tested positively for COVID?

To date, we have been made aware of ten cases (approximately 0.9% of our pupils) who have tested positively for COVID. The majority of these are within our Senior Section. If your child is presenting any of the symptoms of COVID please do not send them in and arrange for a test.

3. Why has my child been asked to self-isolate?

When a positive case is reported to the school, we immediately identify any "close contacts". These pupils (and any staff) are then asked to self-isolate for 14 days. The number of close contacts varies but can be as many as 50 pupils per positive case. In primary, it will often be the whole class (rather than the year group). In Seniors it will be those who sit closest to the positive case – all staff keep accurate seating plans for every lesson. In order to stamp out the virus at Mayfield, our approach is to quickly identify close contacts and ask them to self - isolate. Please rest assured in all cases, we follow PHE advice and inform Portsmouth City Council as well as the DfE. If you have not heard from us directly then your child should attend school as normal.

4. If my child has been asked to self-isolate, should they take a test?

No. They have been asked to work from home as a precaution to stop the spread. They should only take a test if they develop symptoms. Other family members can carry on as normal, unless they develop symptoms. During self-isolation, if your child does develop symptoms and tests positively, then please email Mr. Matt Stedman, Director of Business Operations on:

so we can identify any "close contacts".

5. Can my child return to school before the end of the self-isolation period?

No. It is essential that if your child is asked to self-isolate for a period of time, then they complete this in full. This is because the virus has an incubation period and even if your child tests negatively, they may still be carrying the virus.

6. My child has been asked to self-isolate for less than 14 days, why?

The requirement to self-isolate is 14 days from the date of the potential last contact with a positive case. In some circumstances, the person who has tested positively has been off school already for several days and therefore this time is taken off the 14-day self-isolation period.

7. What should my child do when they are at home?

We strongly encourage setting some routines. Work packs are available to all pupils and in some cases, we will be running 'live teaching' via MS teams.

8. What can I do to help?

For parents and carers of pupils in our Senior Section, please <u>check</u> they have all their essential equipment in a pencil case and have a face covering (plus a spare). The essential equipment that they must have is listed here:

- Black pen and pencil plus spares;
- Purple pen for feedback;
- Glue stick;
- 30cm Ruler and an eraser;
- CASIO Fx Series calculator;
- Reading book (Year 7 and 8 only);
- Water bottle we do not issue cups.

For parents and carers in the Primary Section, please explain why adults need to wear face coverings and why sometimes we must ask them to self-isolate.

In all cases, please reassure your child that for most people, COVID infection will result in mild symptoms only. We are self-isolating and wearing face coverings to protect the most vulnerable in society and stop our NHS from being overwhelmed.

9. My family is suffering financial or emotional hardship. Who can help?
