In Year R this week, the children have been making amazing progress with Little Wandle phonics! They have learnt 16 sounds altogether since starting school: s, a, t, p, i, n, m, d, g, o, c, k, ck, e, u and r. As well as learning the sounds, they have been practising blending these sounds together to make words and have been using the resilient learning superpower to try their best and not give up!

Year 1 have been very busy this week as they have been orally rehearsing the story 'This is the Bear'. They have been writing a short narrative to retell this story.

In Maths, we have been looking at part whole models. We have been exploring and investigating how this works and moving on to solve problems.

Children have thoroughly enjoyed phonic lessons. They are beginning to feel more confident to apply phonic sounds within their writing.



This week Year 3 started addition and subtraction in their maths. We have been revisiting Year 2 learning to help us with our bigger numbers.

In our topic, we have been looking at important parts of the Stone Age culture such as food, farming and tools. We got to try some tasty berries.



Year 4 have loved learning about Roman Numerals this week. They listened to song to help them and enjoyed using the actions to help them remember which Roman numeral represented each number. They then used their knowledge to discover a famous quote by Julius Caesar. If you would like to practise at home the song can be found here <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=z1UmAgekzbs</u>



In Maths, Year 5 have started to learn how to subtract with 5-digit numbers. They have used the column method to do this, as they believe it is the most efficient written method. We have found exchanging across columns quite tricky and so will continue to practice this.

In English, Year 5 have been learning how to use subordinate clauses to extend simple sentences. We have enjoyed learning this through interactive activities to help us understand the difference between main clauses and subordinate clauses.

In D&T, Year 5 have made their prototypes for their solar systems. Through this, they were able to see potential issues with their product before they made the final one. They were very resilient while using some advanced D&T skills!

Year 6 have enjoyed continuing to read Who Let the Gods Out this week. They have spent time planning and writing an account of one character (Virgo) visiting a mortal school and comparing it to their own experiences of school. In maths, they have been looking at rounding and how different contexts determine the necessary accuracy of the rounding-well done Year 6.

Finally, please can I ask that parents and children leave the school site as promptly as possible at 3.30pm pick up and after extra-curricular clubs at 4.30pm.

Reveal-Being NEWSLETTER Welcome to our Mayfield SEND

Welcome to our first newsletter of the Autumn Term and also the first that is being sent out from our brand new building! Summer seems a long way off now but we hope that you managed to have some relaxing time with your families. It's been a turbulent couple of years for so many, and it's crucial to look after yourself and your loved ones.

In this half-term's issue, we'll take a look at the role of the ELSA in school (Emotional Literacy Support Assistant), and also introduce you to a couple of members of our team. Our SEND focus will be on girls with ADHD - they often present differently to boys and we'll have a look at this in more depth.

Finally, we'll look at some activities that are on locally for this half-term break but, to kick off this new issue and this new academic term, we are going to take a look at 'interoception' ... never heard of it? Read on!





If you're sitting still, calm and comfortable, close your eyes

for a moment - can feel or sense your heart beating? Can you, without touching your pulse points, sense its rhythm? Or can you feel nothing at all?

This is a simple way of gauging your body's own interoception – a sense that is different to those we usually think of (such as touch, taste, smell, hearing and sight). Instead, how sensitive you are to your body's interoceptive signals has been shown to determine your capacity to regulate your emotions, and your subsequent susceptibility to mental health problems such as anxiety and depression.

To tune into our bodies can tell us an awful lot about our minds. Much of what goes on between our brains and our bodies is subconscious, we give little thought to it, but

imagine when you are stressed or anxious – it's an emotion yet our bodies have a physical reaction. Our stomach may clench, our jaw may tighten, we might not notice our shoulders tensing and hunching up. However, if we can be aware of these reactions and interpret these feelings, then it can have crucial consequences for our well-being and our recognition of the effect that stresses are having on us – and then, we can take action to combat it. If you'd like to read more about interoception, then there are some excellent articles online.

It's important to try and pre-empt stress-induced burnouts, but this image is really helpful too, for if you've ever got to the stage where you just need to step back and focus on yourself for a while ...

Staff Spotlight

Who is our ELSA and what does the role involve?

ELSA support in schools is designed to help us best support the emotional needs of our pupils. ELSA acknowledges that children and young people learn best when they feel happier and their emotional needs are being addressed. Our ELSA at Mayfield is Mrs Gardner and if we feel that a young person

needs some extra emotional support, then a special referral can be made to her via their Head of House, or our SENCo, Mrs

Anders. When this happens, Mrs Gardner will meet with the student, assess their needs, and then schedule some timetabled sessions.



We asked Mrs Gardner to give us an overview of her role and what she does at school. Here's what she said:

"I am the Emotional Literacy Support Assistant (ELSA) at Mayfield school. I am employed to support pupils with their emotional needs and to understand their emotions. To provide time and space for pupils to talk about their personal circumstances and how they manage them. I enjoy my role as I work with a variety of pupils, and it is rewarding to see them grow and develop during their time at Mayfield. Being emotionally literate helps children focus better on their learning." – Mrs Gardner, ELSA

An introduction to Mrs Doyle, who is an LSA (Learning Support Assistant) in seniors

"I have been working in the SEN department for 2 years at Mayfield. I am especially interested in Social Emotional Mental Health and ASD (Autistic Spectrum Disorder) and working with those students. I enjoy being able to open doors for students who might be struggling to access the mainstream lessons. I have worked in SEN for 6 years with a variety of students who have different needs in different settings."



ADHD in Girls

How does it differ to ADHD in boys?

Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder is often associated with affecting boys but, more and more often, girls are being diagnosed with ADHD. When girls are diagnosed with ADHD, they are more likely to have what is known as 'inattentive ADHD', in which daydreaming and shyness are common, whereas it is more typical for boys to present as hyperactive and unable to maintain attention or focus. According to www.verywellmind.com, living with undiagnosed ADHD can result in "disadvantages, such as a lack of accommodations in the classroom, low self-esteem, and self-blame. Gone undiagnosed, ADHD can even affect mental health well into adolescence and adulthood. Being aware of the different ways ADHD can present in your daughter can help you know when it might be time to see a doctor for an evaluation".

The following are some symptoms that can be found in girls with ADHD but it should be made clear that having one or two of these on their own does not indicate nor diagnose ADHD. A much bigger picture of a young person is required to fully assess them, and they would need to be presenting with many of these traits, consistently, and over a sustained, long period of time. Many of the following may simply

be a child's personality but, if you are concerned, then having a discussion with an experienced professional would be beneficial:

- Appears withdrawn
- Cries easily
- Daydreaming and in a world of her own
- Difficulty maintaining focus; easily distracted
- Disorganised and messy (in her appearance and physical space)
- Doesn't appear to be trying
- Doesn't seem motivated
- Forgetful
- Highly sensitive to noise, fabrics, and emotions
- Hyper-talkative (always has lots to say, but is not good at listening)
- Hyperreactivity (exaggerated emotional responses)
- Looks to be making "careless" mistakes
- Might often slam her doors shut
- Often late (poor time management)
- Problems completing tasks
- Seems shy
- Seems to get easily upset
- Shifting focus from one activity to another
- Takes time to process information and directions; seems like she doesn't hear you
- Verbally impulsive; blurts out and interrupts other
