Welcome to the fourth "Mayfield Messenger" since the partial school closure was announced.

Once again, I am delighted to report that we remained as popular as ever with over 5 applications per place making us one of the most oversubscribed schools in Portsmouth. Please rest assured that we are planning a number of events to ensure you and your child have a smooth transition into our school. As we get more information about when and how we can run these events, we will be in touch!

As you are no doubt aware, the Government have extended the period of lockdown "for at least a further three weeks". Therefore, I can formally confirm that Mayfield remains open only to "Key Workers" and vulnerable pupils. The message to our local community remains the same:

"The Government expects most children and their families to stay home and be safe. The key worker school @ Mayfield is open to the children of key workers or those considered vulnerable only if they cannot be safely looked after at home".

Eligible parents and carers can sign up for this provision using our online booking system – this is the same system you will have used to book a place for a parents evening or extra-curricular club. Following feedback from parents and carers we have split each day into sessions as follows:

07:45 to 08:45	Breakfast Club
08:45 to 13:00*	Session 1
08:45 to 15:00*	Session 2
08:45 to 16:30**	Session 3
16:30 to 18:00	Tea Time Club (Primary aged "Key Worker" children only and chargeable)

^{*}A free hot lunch is served between 12:00pm and 1:00pm.

The booking system will close at 9:00 am on the working day beforehand and parents or carers can opt for as many full or part days as are needed. Children can be collected at the end of session 1, 2 or 3. Pupils will still be expected to wear their full school uniform and bring a PE kit if they are taking part in Session 3. We will also offer some guidance as to the amount of time we think pupils should be spending on their home learning, as well as ideas about exercise and other non-curriculum activities. We understand now that schools will not be required to submit to the Department for Education any primary school assessments such as the early years foundation stage profile, phonics testing or KS1 SATs. However, it is clear that we will need to ensure that teacher assessments are recorded so that any "gaps" pupils may have can be "filled". I would like to reassure you that our staff are now planning on how this important information can be best captured and appropriately shared with pupils, parents or carers.

For parents or carers of pupils in Year 11 only, we can confirm:

- Teachers will be asked to use their professional judgement to produce a grade for each pupil they teach;
- Within each grade, teachers will be asked to numerically rank the pupils within that grade;
- Judgements will be based on a wide range of sources including mock grades, coursework, classwork, homework and the progress the child has made to date;

- The school will ensure an internal moderation process is undertaken;
- No further work needs to be set or collected in to support a teacher's judgement;
- Individual grades or the rank within these grades **cannot** be shared with pupils or their families.

Our preparations around the reopening of the school are now well in hand. We are actively looking at how we can operate our school whilst also protecting staff and pupils from the risk of infection. As our plans develop, I will, of course, share these with you.

As you can imagine, many children and families who were already vulnerable will face even greater pressures and challenges during this pandemic. Moreover, some families that were previously coping are finding themselves now struggling - financially, emotionally and with practical every day issues. As a school we have developed a contact system to enable a 'watchful eye' on our vulnerable children and families - both those we know already, plus families that we are aware are 'made vulnerable' by the pandemic.
