Mayfield is able to access additional funding for any pupil who fits the criteria for 'Pupil Premium' (PP). This includes:

- Pupils who are eligible for Free School Meals (FSM), i.e. school age pupils whose household income is less than £16,190 or pupils who have been entitled to a FSM in any of the preceding six years;
- Service Personnel Children i.e. the child of a parent (s) who works in the UK armed forces;
- Any child who has left Local Authority care due to adoption, guardianship or subject to a Child Arrangement Order.

Family Learning Week letter

The topic will continue with the theme 'Winter'. In class we are still looking at texture, shape and form to create artwork and achieve their planned effect. Children are learning to articulate their own ideas and adapt their work if necessary.

Learning intentions linked to class subject:
