A message from Mr Howard

"Follow the three R's. -Respect for self. -Respect for others. -Responsibility for all your actions." Dalai Lama Welcome back! I hope that you all had a good half term break. The week started with my assembly which focussed on one of our 6 R's – 'Responsible' which linked to another – 'Respect'.

After introducing 'The UN Convention on the Rights of the Child' we all recognised the importance of also being aware of our <u>RESPONSIBILITIES</u>, to ensure that everyone can enjoy their human rights. The children thought about their responsibilities in school. These were some of their responses.

We (children) have the responsibility to:

- make the most of our education and encourage others to develop their abilities. This includes arriving to school and individual classes on time and attending classes with whatever equipment is necessary.





Confirmation of Strike day (Thursday 2nd March 2023) - Partially closed

The school will be open to;

- Year 11 pupils for period 1 and 2 mock exam
- Pupils with a current Education, Health and Care Plan
- Pupils eligible for Free School Meals during lunch time only

As you are aware, following on from previous communications and the strike on the 1st February 2023, the next proposed strike date is on Thursday 2nd March 2023.

Other strike days are:

- Wednesday 15 March 2023
- Thursday 16 March 2023

As I stated before, members of the unions are not required to let employers know ahead of time whether they intend to strike.

Based on the previous and current information, we will be <u>partially closed</u>. The school will only be open for <u>pupils in Year 11 – period 1 and period 2 (mock exam)</u> and those <u>pupils who currently have an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP)</u>. The school will also be open during lunchtime for <u>pupils eligible</u> for Free School Meals.

It is very important that all year 11 attend for this exam.

At the end of the exam, Year 11 pupils would be able to go home to continue their revision. As always, the decision to partially close has not been taken lightly. Again, I do realise that this will cause difficulties for parents and carers.

Teachers taking strike action are not required to set cover work and so the work may be general work rather than lesson specific.

Free School Meals

• <u>Primary</u>

For primary pupils who are eligible for free school meals, we will be providing a hot meal during the lunchtime. This will be from 12pm – 12:45pm. We will be sending out a form for parents and carers of primary aged pupils eligible for Free school meals to sign up to this offer.

The children will need to arrive at the main reception area to be registered at 12pm and then collected at 12:45pm from outside the main school hall.

Seniors

Senior pupils eligible for free school meals are able to arrive between 1pm-1:15pm at Kensington gate entrance where they will be registered and taken through to the canteen to collect and enjoy their lunch. They will leave once they have finished their lunch.
