This week, Year R have enjoyed observing zoo animals on live cameras. We've been keeping the cameras on all day to see the animals when they sleep, when they get fed and we kept hoping to see them being cheeky too! We recorded what we saw by writing animal diaries in our 'VIP' time.

In Letters and Sounds, the children have been learning how to read the -ing suffix on the end of words to make reading those words faster. They have been incredibly resilient and have been able to read words such as zooming, singing and chatting.

In maths, Year R have been exploring the concept of doubling using Number Blocks and dot patterns. They are beginning to notice the patterns with doubles and can explain that the numbers need to be the 'same'.

This week Year 1 have been working hard to write their recounts about their trip to Marwell Zoo. Our teachers are very impressed with the writing that has been produced!

In maths, we have been recapping addition and subtraction within 20 and even got to spend some time outside learning in the lovely sunshine.

Year 2 have been learning all about fractions and how to make sure that all the parts of the whole are equal. We have also enjoyed using thesaurus to look up synonyms for adjectives from our new English text 'The Ugly Five'. In Science, we have been looking at plants that live in different habitats and are suited to grow there. Thank you for all the boxes so far ready for our DT project next Wednesday, it is not too late to send one in on Monday.

This week, Year 3 were invaded by a dinosaur in our assembly! We have been using this to help us write a news report to recount this crazy event. In our maths, we have looked at finding halves and thirds of shapes and amounts.





This week Year 4 have been working scientifically to investigate different shapes of boat to see why the Vikings chose to use long boats to invade. In English, we have started writing our adventure stories which we are excited to share with parents. Please keep an eye out on the Sims app and in book bags for a letter confirming details of this event next week.







This week, Year 5 have been busy learning about different states of the USA! They have enjoyed picking their favourite states and planning for a burger which reflects this state. In 2 weeks, the children will make their burgers by using many different skills. We can't wait to see their end products!

In maths, Year 5 have been continuing to learn about decimals. They have been comparing decimals to fractions and percentages. Please see their homework for specific methods of working.

Year 6 have had a great week, extending their understanding of reading maps. They enjoyed drawing contour lines on potatoes to help them understand how maps show relief and using string to understand how maps use scales. The children enjoyed measuring distances around the city and recognising the distance travelled cannot be measured in a straight line. In maths, the children have been revising their knowledge of the four operations, in preparation for their end of key stage assessments. In English, they have been writing their own Survival stories based upon Nigel Long's book of the same name.

Portsmouth Young Carers Service: Supporting Young Carers living in Portsmouth

Our service

We offer free to access support for children and young people living in Portsmouth who are young carers.

Who is a young carer?

A young person under the age of 18 who cares for or helps to care for a family member with a:

- Long-term illness
- Physical or learning disability
- Mental health condition
- or who misuse substances



"I care for my older and younger siblings. I find it hard when my sister cries when she goes into school." Portsmouth Young Carer

Unique young carers

- · The experiences and needs of each young carer are unique.
- The amount and type of care they provide can vary greatly and this can impact their health and wellbeing in different ways. They may be emotionally affected, have limited access to social situations or worry about the person they care for.

How does Portsmouth Young Carers Service support young carers?

- Help young carers to understand their caring role and identify and build their own positive support network.
- Provide opportunities for breaks from caring responsibilities and to meet up with other young people who understand how they feel.
- Support professionals to understand about young carers needs, the impact these might have and how to support young carers sensitively and effectively.

As part of the Early Help & Prevention Service we support young carers to:

- Enjoy their childhood and avoid taking on excessive caring responsibilities.
- · Recognise their aspirations and support them to achieve their full potential.
- Encourage attendance and attainment in school/college.

Our current offer:

- A monthly young carers and family email with information and ideas
- Opportunities for young carers between the ages of 5 and 18 to have a break from their caring responsibilities through:
 - Holiday activity programmes (for 5 to 18-year-olds)
 - Regular groups (for 8 to 25-year-olds) supporting different age groups across the city.
- Time bonded one-to-one support for more vulnerable young carers who are not specifically being supported by another professional, with a focus decided with the young person.
- Young Carer representation for a young person at multi-professional meetings.
- Young carer's awareness raising, including training for organisations and school assemblies for young people.
- Team Around the Worker support for professionals working with young carers.
