Covid Vaccinations at Mayfield School on Wednesday 16th February 2022

Second dose covid vaccinations can now being offered to 12–15 year olds and therefore Mayfield School will be hosting the School Immunisation Team on Wednesday 16th February 2022. The team would like to offer an opportunity for eligible young people to have their second dose vaccination in school on the above date.

There are also a number of young people in this age group who have not had their first dose and this could be for a number of reasons. They will also offer a first dose vaccination to this group on the above date for those who missed out previously.

Since the last vaccination date in school earlier this year, there will be some young people who have since turned 12 years of age and are now eligible for their first dose – vaccinations will now be offered to this group on the above date.

Parents still have the option of making appointments for their eligible young people via the National Booking System, if they prefer.

The benefits of the vaccine are clear:

- It is estimated that a 60% vaccine uptake among healthy 12- to 15-year-olds will reduce confirmed cases of COVID-19 in this group in the period up to 31 March 2022 by 33%. This equates to a reduction of 110,000 school days absent in this age group due to confirmed COVID-19 cases.
- Research shows that those who do become infected 3 weeks after receiving one dose of the vaccine are between 38% and 49% less likely to pass the virus on to their household contacts than those who are unvaccinated.

Consent forms will be given to students on Thursday 10th February and must be returned to Pupil Services by Monday 14th February 3pm.

Guidance for administering paracetamol in school

A reminder to parents/carers that paracetamol can only be given out from the medical room between 10.45am-2pm. This is to reduce the risk of children having too much paracetamol within the correct timescales.

It has been a huge relief to get the main entrance open to all our pupils and carers this week. Thank you all for your patience whilst we have been putting new systems in place. Please can I remind parents that the gates close promptly at 8.45am so please ensure that you arrive before this time.

A number of parents and staff have raised concerns about parking on the zigzag lines at the front of school. Please do not use the lines for parking, even if it is to let a pupil out of the car to walk into school. The front of the school is always very busy, and the safety of our families is a priority.

Today we are wishing "good luck" to junior pupils and staff for the first ever Mayfield Primary Dance Live entry. The staff and pupils have worked so hard on rehearsals for this, and we cannot wait to find out how they get on. Go Team Mayfield!

Several children have been bringing Nutella into their lunch boxes either in pots or sandwiches. Please note that we do not allow nuts to be brought into school due to pupils with severe nut allergies being present.

Year R have been learning all about the celebration of Chinese New Year! They have been taking part in some of the traditions such as cleaning, ready for the new year, and making decorations. They were very excited to watch the dragon dance and enjoyed reading stories all about the celebration.

Year R have also finished learning all Phase 2 and 3 sounds from Little Wandle this week! The remainder of Phase 3 phonics will focus on reading longer words, such as 'rabbit' and 'digger', and reading more complex sentences to build their fluency. Please keep reading the e-books and library books to support with this.

In maths, the children have been learning about the concept of 'more', 'fewer' and 'equal'. They have been using this mathematical language to make comparisons between a number of objects. They have also learnt that it does not matter about the colour or size when comparing quantities and have been explaining this to other adults around the school.

This week, Year 1 have been learning all about the different seasons and the weather that is associated with these. We looked at a weather forecast and made our own predictions for the United Kingdom.

In Maths we have been practising how to count in 2s and recognising the pattern.

We are continuing our search to find Dogger too!



Year 2 had a fantastic learning experience visiting Portsmouth Museum on Wednesday and all of them behaved in a way that was a credit to Mayfield. They enjoyed visiting John Pounds workshop and seeing what he did to support poor children in Portsmouth over 200 years ago. This week in Maths we have been using grouping skills to divide. We had a very exciting letter arrive on Tuesday asking us to assist 'The Queen'. Please ask your child about this as it is linked to our English learning, and we used the letter as a way to inspire their ideas.

Year 3 wanted to thank all the people that attended the beach clean. It was a great success. After the beach clean, we started thinking about our observations of the beach. We used a similar free verse poem from The Wild Robot to create our own poem about the polluted beach. We then performed our poems, some of us were brave enough to do this in front of their whole class. In Maths, we have been looking at grouping and sharing for division. We are so proud of how resilient Year 3 have been this week.



This week Year 4 have been very busy. In Topic we have been exploring Anglo-Saxon artwork and designed metal work with intricate patterns. We have also been recapping what we know about sound by producing our own TV programmes. In maths, we have continued to work on written multiplication methods and in English we have been looking at different tenses that we can include in our diary entries.



This week, Year 5 have made torture devices in D&T! This was part of their project on researching how crime and punishment has changed over time. While making their models, they used new joining skills.

In Maths, Year 5 have started to learn about fractions. They have explored how to find equivalent fractions using formal methods.

Please remember that next week is Bikeability for Year 5! Bikes and helmets must be in school by Monday morning. They will be kept in the school bike shed for the week, so please bring your bike through the entrance on Kensington Road on Monday morning. If children need to take their bike home each day, they will collect from the bike shed and wheel them through to the main entrance for the usual pick up at 3.30pm or 4.30pm.

Year 6 have enjoyed a week beginning to understand a new mathematical concept: ratio. The children enjoyed exploring ratio by creating their own mocktails and by beginning to understand the relationship between the different amounts. They then moved onto exploring the relationship between different numbers in the same sequence and exploring the links with fractions and multiplication. In writing, the children have enjoyed rehearsing orally explanation texts focusing on how Doctor Who's sonic screwdriver works. In art, the children have been researching the artist, Hokusai, and how he created his work.
