# **Growth Checks for Children in Year 6**

Please find attached the screening letter which all Year 6 parents/carers need to have seen and read.

Children in Year 6 have their height and weight checked at school as part of the National Child Measurement Programme (NCMP). Height and weight are used to calculate weight categories of children.



This helps the NHS understand how many children are overweight, healthy weight or underweight. Your child's class will take part in this year's programme.

The checks are done by trained health care support workers. Children are measured with their clothes on, except for their coats and shoes. This is done in a private space away from other pupils.

#### Use of mobile phones in school and outside of school

Over the past 5 weeks, we have been working hard to discourage the use of mobile phones in the school building and as a result, the majority of pupils have either handed their phone in or not brought it to school. We have also had individual communication with parents/carers about this and they have supported the school by ensuring mobile phones are not brought in.

We will be looking at this in more detail over the next 2 weeks so that the use of technology in school, particularly through the use of mobile phones and social networking, is swiftly responded to. Through our education programme and e-safety work, students are regularly reminded of the advantages and the hidden dangers of using particular sites.

Unfortunately, some students and on occasions, parents use these sites to try to settle friendship issues that have arisen both in school and the local community. Often, when social networking is used inappropriately in 'friendship' situations the school is expected to solve the problems. As you would appreciate this is very difficult to achieve. We would ask that parents/carers support us by discouraging the use of social media for such purposes. Equally, we would advise any parent/carer of a child who is on the receiving end of unkind comments or actions NOT to post anything on social media as adult involvement rarely solves the issue and is often regarded as antagonistic or even threatening to the minor on the receiving end. Parents/carers are encouraged to seek advice from the school or the police if they are concerned about derogatory comments which have been posted about their child.

When a student uses their mobile phone to contact parents/carers during the school day about a situation that has arisen in school. It is very upsetting for any parent to hear their child report an issue which has occurred in school. There are always two sides to any situation and schools are best placed to establish the facts. We would ask parents/carers to respect our guidelines which are that students should not make contact via mobile phone during the school day. If a child does contact a parent it is more helpful for the parent to contact the school for further details before any conclusions are reached. We would ask parents to trust the judgement of the school and abide and support us in the restricted use of mobile phones during the school day.

As you know, we have children in our school with severe nut allergies. <u>Please could you ensure that</u> none of these foods are in your child's lunches. Thank you.


# This week's successes outside of Mayfield are;
