Whilst it seems odd in the current climate, I would like to wish all members of our community a 'Happy New Year'. I hope that you and your wider family are in good health.

It has been an eventful few days, and therefore this issue of the Mayfield Messenger is a little longer than usual.

Key Worker School

You will be aware that the Government have instigated a National Lockdown and that, by law, we should "stay home. Stay safe. Protect the NHS". School remains open for the children of 'critical workers'. Please be aware that the demand for space in 'key worker school' (KWS) has been exceptionally high and we ask that **even if you are eligible, you consider carefully if you need to access this provision and use KWS as a last, rather than a first, resort.** By reducing the numbers, we help stop the spread and minimise risk to staff. You can check to see if you are eligible by using the link below:

Once you have established that you do qualify for this support, and you have no alternative, then please send your child in only for those days that are necessary – children in KWS follow the same timetable and curriculum as their classmates at home.

Be aware that we will seek proof of your entitlement to this provision by asking for evidence such as an ID badge, payslip, contract or letter of employment.

Importantly, you should not send your child into school until you have an email confirming that we have allocated a space to them.

SEN School

We also remain open to support children considered 'vulnerable' as per the above guidance. We have now contacted all the pupils who this applies to and invited them in. If you have any questions about this provision, then please contact Mrs. Erika Anders, on:

Expectations for onsite provision

We have further developed our risk assessment in light of the latest guidance. It is essential that if your child is showing symptoms of COVID 19 then they do not come into school. When in school, pupils will be required to take the usual protective measures depending on their age.

Please be aware that if your child is attending KWS or SEN school then they will be following the same timetable and curriculum as those learning from home. Our expectations of uniform and equipment remain the same and we require all pupils to wear their full school uniform and observe all our normal dress and behaviour rules. Please note that if a pupil's behaviour falls short of our standards and they consistently breach our risk assessment, we reserve the right to withdraw their place and offer an alternative provision instead.

Exams

Recently the DfE have confirmed that all GCSE exams in year 11 as well as Key Stage 1 and 2 assessments for Summer 2021 have now been cancelled. We understand that pupils will receive a teacher 'centre assessed grade'. We do not yet have the details about how this will work and will, of course, keep you updated with reference to the process once guidance has been published. We would

be grateful if you would reassure all pupils that they should continue to engage with their on-site or remote learning since this will prepare them for the next step in their journey.

Remote Learning

You will be aware that the Government have now placed a duty on schools to provide 'high quality remote learning' in the case where a school is partially open. To ensure that all pupils make good progress, we have decided that children accessing our KWS provision and SEN school will follow the same timetable and curriculum as those learning from home. Our approach to online teaching is to provide children with a mix of 'live' teaching and pre-recorded sessions. Free School Meals

We will be sending out a weekly Tesco voucher to provide free school meals for eligible children who are not in school. The vouchers for the week beginning 4th January will be sent out on 11th January, worth £3 for each day that your child was studying at home. This scheme only applies to families who qualify for free school meals based on their family income. The universal infant free school meals are not covered by this scheme.

Lateral Flow Testing

It is essential that all pupils within our Senior Section complete a registration and consent form – even if you do not want your child to take a test. The BBC are launching lots of Primary Learning via CBBC next week (3 hours per day) so please use this if you need to in order to help pupils engage in learning each day. If you have been logging in remotely, please continue to do so and please do contact teachers if you need help with particular tasks. Our formats will be "tweaked" over the coming weeks but please be assured that we are working hard to ensure that all children are safe and engaged with learning.

Head of Pre-school and Nursery

Welcome back after the Christmas break and Happy New Year to you all.

As you are now all aware the government has introduced a nationwide lock down with all primary and secondary education being instructed to close, this does not include us the Nursery and Pre-school, we remain open. The protocols the government have asked us to put into place remain the same along with the class bubbles to help prevent the spread of the infection which minimises the risk to your children and my staff.
