On our INSET day this week staff have been developing their ICT skills to support learning with our pupils. Your child should get into the habit of checking their school email account daily- please remind them of this! Each year as a school we take part in Restart a Heart day. Although this year we cannot run the same range of activities we are having an assembly to remind the pupils and staff about "What to do" if they ever end up in a position where they need to carry out CPR. Please remember that there is a very useful app that you can download- "Save a life"- which shows the position of all the defibrillators in the country. In an emergency it would be a useful thing to have on your phone.

Years 7 and 8 should be working on their Autumn 1 Prep projects. There are details of these on our website here. Please do talk to your child about how they are getting on.

Can I please take the opportunity to remind you that pupils are not allowed to wear any jewellery to school- including rings. Pupils need to remove them before they arrive. Pupils who do not follow our expectations around jewellery and uniform are provided with alternative working arrangements.

Lastly, a reminder that if bikes or scooters are brought onto the school site, children must be wearing a helmet. Please make sure that bikes and scooters must be stored inside the bike sheds.
