At 11:00am on Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> November we will be observing a two-minute silence to support **Remembrance 2020**. I would strongly encourage every pupil to consider purchasing a "poppy" and wearing this to show their support. The Senior Prefects and myself will record a short assembly to explain the significance of this event. Please note that during the silence we will close our office and reception area.

Following the Government's announcement of a National Lockdown we will implement the following modifications to our current practices:

## Face Coverings

From Monday 9<sup>th</sup> November, we strongly urge all parents and carers when coming onto the school site to wear a face covering when dropping off or picking up children in our Primary Section.

Additionally, as a further tightening of current practices within our Senior Section, we will require pupils in Years 7 to 11 to wear a face covering when:

- arriving to, or leaving, the school site;
- when in corridors at any time (not just during changeover of lessons).

Pupils may choose to wear a face covering at other times such as in lessons or during their social times – but this is not compulsory since pupils will be in their 'year bubbles'.

This requirement does not apply to Primary Section children.

### One-way system

### Head of Pre-school and Nursery

Welcome back after the half term. This is the last part of the academic year and it is a busy time in class, rehearsals have already started for this year's Christmas Nativity and are going well.

Learning intentions:

#### What to do if your child develops symptoms of COVID 19

If your child develops symptoms of COVID-19, they must not come to school and should remain at home for at least **10 days** from the day their symptoms appeared. Anyone with

All other household members who remain well, must stay at home, and not leave the house for 14 days. This includes anyone in your **'Support Bubble'**.
