The dancing was of a very high standard and our team produced an excellent display of dance, creativity and movement. It was an amazing evening and our team thoroughly deserved third place. The children represented the school excellently and they were rightly proud of their achievements, as was everyone who went to cheer them on. Both our senior and primary teams are already thinking about next years' event.

It is definitely turning out to be a very successful year for our sports and dance teams.

In addition to the success, we had much celebration. In the build up to the King's Coronation, our primary pupils celebrated the significant event in style with an outdoor street party. The field by the main entrance was full of pupils dressed in red, white and with handmade crowns. blue pupils enjoyed their cake The and squash, sang the National anthem, and ended the afternoon with a very loud version of 'Sweet Caroline'! It was also interesting to hear pupils' views about the **Coronation after the Bank holiday** weekend.

The importance of raising awareness of anxiety and mental

health was highlighted during Mental Health Awareness Week. Pupils and staff across the school thought about ways in which they can help themselves, and each other, if they are feeling anxious. It was also great to see so many people showing their support by wearing their green ribbons and primary pupils and staff dressed in a variety of shades of green. This support saw us raise £351.48 for the Mental Health Foundation.

This time of the year for schools has seen pupils across the Key stages taking tests. The first being Year 6 who took their statutory KS2 tests. This led into the Year 2 statutory KS1 tests and now the Year 11 GCSE exams. The pupils across the school have been demonstrating positive attitude and great a resilience to do their best and apply their knowledge. They have supported each other immensely, whether that be a handshake, a good luck, or a fist pump. There is a sense of togetherness when we all understand the pressures that we and others may face. As a result, pupils have shown care, empathy, and thoughtfulness and have approached these tests with increased confidence.





I was honoured to be called to judge in a Year 7 Geography lesson where the formation of stacks was being modelled in Lego!



This term Endeavour have been focusing on our local community to build a positive relationship and help others.



Careers Talks

During the house assemblies all secondary pupils had a talk from a member of our extended community who is a solicitor. He talked about his pathway to this career and role and responsibilities of the job. He was informative and has offered his time to come back and run a mock trial with pupils who are interested in this industry in the Autumn term.

Year 11 pupils have had the University of Portsmouth in for a talk about their futures post 18 and to think about degree apprenticeships and the aspiration of attending university.

Year 10 pupils have had assemblies from Havant and South Downs College and City Of Portsmouth College about their taster days next half term. They have selected their choices and more information will be coming out on class charts about these trips.

Year R

This half term, the children really enjoyed our 'All Creatures Great and Small' topic. We have explored all different animals, from tiny insects to Pearl the horse (we met her on our farm trip!) The Longdown Activity Farm trip was certainly a highlight for children and staff alike. The children took on the roles of farmers and helped look after the animals. We bottle fed baby goats, held chicks and guinea pigs, and then collected eggs for the farm shop. I was very proud of how polite and wellmannered our children were, they represented Mayfield School so well.

We have also welcomed some caterpillars into our classroom so we can look at how they turn into butterflies. In our phonics lessons, we have continued to recap all the sounds we have learned since starting school. The children are now growing in confidence when it comes to reading longer words. We are now focusing on writing sentences and using capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.

In Maths, we have been exploring teen numbers and how the '1' represents 10! The children have used resources such as multilink and Numicon to support their understanding of this. We then moved on to addition and subtraction using the phrase 'First, then, Now' - 'First there were 5 people on the bus, then 2 more people get on, now there are 7 people on the bus!'

We have had lots of fun this half term and we look forward to what the next half term brings.

The children in year 1 have had an exciting time with our Gardener's World topic this half term. We visited Harold Hillier Gardens where we were classifying different trees, made smelly caterpillars, and explored pond dipping. We were very excited to catch newts, and different creatures in our nets.

In our science lessons we named common plants and trees and were able to name and locate the different parts of trees and plants.



In Maths, we have enjoyed exploring counting in 2s, 5s and 10s, and making arrays. We also worked on sharing out equal groups with objects and numbers. In literacy we were reading the story 'Jack and the Jellybean Stalk.' We worked on extending our sentences using 'and,' 'or,' 'because,' exploring sweets and using adjectives to describe them to make our sentences more interesting. In phonics we have been reviewing our phase 3 and 5 sounds and working hard to recognise them in real and alien words ready for our phonic screening assessment in Summer 2.

Finally, the children in the Turtle class presented an amazing assembly to their parents, which showed what we have been learning in Year 1 this term.

In Year 2, the children have enjoyed their topic of 'Animals and their Habitats.' We have been finding out all about microhabitats and why different creatures live there. We even found some microhabitats on our playground!

The children enjoyed their exciting morning making delicious jam sandwiches, before reading the book 'The Disgusting Sandwich' and then designing their own! Some children even made their 'disgusting' sandwiches in the garden at home! In maths, we have been looking at finding fractions of amounts and understanding time.

The children loved celebrating the Coronation of King Charles III. They had a fantastic time creating their own crowns and being royalty for the day!

As a year group we have really been enjoying our My Happy Mind sessions and have been practising applying these skills together. We have been working on solving problems together, taking turns and working as a team.

Year 3 have really enjoyed their 'Inventors' topic this term. We started the term by continuing our learning about the Romans with a specific focus on the inventions that the Romans brought to Britain and were fascinated to find out about all of the different items.

In Science, we learned how many inventions used magnets and spent lots of time using magnets to find out which things are magnetic or non-magnetic and how magnets work. At the end of our topic, as part of our DT unit, we invited parents in to our 'Crazy Invention fair' to show them inventions that the children had designed and made.

In English, we have been learning about writing using direct speech and have enjoyed writing a mini story about Tuffy the Killer Cat.

In Maths, we have been measuring in grams and kilograms and have been reading scales which are numbered and unnumbered.

We also really enjoyed celebrating the King's coronation by making our very own Royal crowns.

We were also really lucky to have a visitor on Roman day who was dressed as a Roman soldier and could bring their learning to life. The children really enjoyed finding out new facts about the Romans, completing Roman themed role play, making aquaducts and trying on some Roman armour themselves.

The children in Year 4 have had a fantastic start to the summer term. The first week back, the children completed a sponsored run, in aid of the earthquake appeal. It was great to see the entire cohort running and being physically active – all for a good cause. It was an event that was enjoyed by all.

This half term also saw the start of swimming lessons in Year 4. Once a week, on a Thursday, the children attended lessons at Mountbatten. It was enjoyed by all and a real weekly highlight. Many of our children became more confident in the water as the weeks progressed.

In the summer term, in English, the children have been looking at the classic children's book, The Twits by Roald Dahl. The children were very engaged with the book and loved writing about the horrible, ugly characters and using some amazing descriptive language. The work produced was very neat and our focus on handwriting is really paying off. Maths, this half term, has had the focus on times tables. The children have worked very hard at learning their tables and using Rock Stars both in school and at home. In Science, the children had fun building circuits and carrying out investigations. We had some real 'light bulb' moments in our lessons.

This half-term, Year 5 have enjoyed learning about the British Monarchy through our topic: Who's Got the Power. The children explored the concepts of absolute and constitutional monarchy before learning about key time frames. They attempted their own versions of the Magna Carta, how the Civil War changed the power of monarchs and how the nation has been influenced by invasions since William the Conqueror.

The children enjoyed discussing the concept of power and how it can be manipulated in their writing unit on Romeo and Juliet. They explored how Shakespeare used themes in his writing and how modern day films and books are often based around his work.



In Science, the children have been learning about living things and their life cycles, before using their analytical skills to compare and contrast different examples. Their knowledge of living things was also used in their explanation text, where they explored a fictional video of giraffes diving into a swimming pool.

The childrens' maths has been focused on decimals, and fractional equivalence. They have enjoyed using their knowledge of times tables in different contexts and growing in confidence in their mathematical abilities.

Year 5 also greatly enjoyed undertaking their Bikeability training and were excellent ambassadors to the school in passing the assessmentswell done and great job Team 5!

Year 6 have had an incredibly busy half-term but have taken every week in their stride. The first half involved preparing the children for their end of KS2 tests whilst continuing our learning about the Ancient Egyptians. During SATS week they were a credit to Mayfield School and all the staff involved in this process were extremely complimentary about the determination and effort the children put into these tests.

We have enjoyed planning, designing and creating our Egyptian death masks, alongside learning about the life of Cleopatra and her journey to power.

In science, we have been learning about light, and the unique properties it has. The children were particularly curious about why light cannot bend around corners and planned and carried out a variety of tests to explore this phenomenon. In English, the children have enjoyed starting their new reading book 'The Nowhere Emporium' and are excited to see how this fantastic story unfolds. They have also been practising their letter writing and using a range of devices to engage the reader with their choice of language and vocabulary.
