This did mean that we needed to teach an extra 2 lessons a week in the Autumn term, to allow for this however we then caught up in Spring 1. To ensure that all pupils achieved the home learning Maths objectives, we spent the rest of Spring 2 (while in school) re-teaching the objectives at an accelerated rate. From Summer 1, we are following a normal maths overview, but are still holding an extra 2 Maths lessons a week, to ensure the pupils and confident on all objectives. The focus will be to encourage pupils to enjoy reading, and to teach them how to find books that they enjoy.	An additional 'Shared reading' session will be taught every week for the Summer term.
