

Dear Parent/Carer,

Although the school is currently closed due to Coronavirus, we are continuing to provide educational tasks for your children to complete.

In primary, we suggest that children complete;

- 30 minutes a day reading to/with an adult (this could be a bedtime story)
- 30 minutes of Maths a day
- 30 minutes of English a day
- 30 minutes of PE/ physical activity
- A weekly topic/creative task

Home learning tasks can be supplemented with work from a number of websites (see list below for ideas)

Teachers will set a weekly programme for your child to work through at home. This will be available for you to access on the school website every Monday.

Whilst it is important for your child to keep up with their learning at home, we appreciate that this can be a stressful time for children and adults. Looking after mental health is vital. Therefore, we suggest that the day is broken up into manageable learning chunks, interspersed with physical exercise, fun activities and time together as a family. Activities such as the 30 day lego challenge and using the real PE activities could be a good place to start.

As well as educational learning, the children could also begin to learn different life skills – how do boil an egg, sew on a button, learn to send an email, bake a cake using a recipe book etc.

We hope you are all keeping well and staying positive.

ENGLISH TASKS

MONDAY – bubble/home learning I can write sentences.

Write sentences for this picture. Don't forget capital letters, full stops, cursive letters. It can be a story, questions or just what you can see.



TUESDAY – bubble/homelearning I can write a dictated sentence.

Adult to slowly read out the words for you to use all the correct skills to write out these sentences.

It is best not to jump on the bed.

A tent will get damp in the rain.

The belt is so tight, it hurts.

I think that the pink socks will be the best. WEDNESDAY –

I can recall previous sounds taught. Recap on Ph4 phonics

- Use a one-minute timer to see how many times you can correctly write each word.
- Using colouring pens/pencils rainbow write the words.
- Find the words hidden in your garden and write them down when you find them.

FRIDAY –

I can write a letter.

Today write a letter to your friend/relative and drop it through their letter box. Tell them what you have been up to and ask how they are. Make sure you use capital letters, full stops, cursive letters and use your phonic knowledge.

MATHS TASKS

MONDAY – I can order numbers to 20.

Just have three or four numbers up to 20. Put them in order. Which is the largest/smallest amount? How do you know?

TUESDAY - I can recognise the place value in numbers up to 20.

Practise making some teen numbers using straws, spaghetti or lego. Bunch the amounts into 10s. How many tens and ones does the number have? For example, 14 has one ten and 4 ones.

WEDNESDAY – I can recognise place value up to 30.

Get familiar with a 100 square! (Play splat100 if you are at home

THURSDAY - I can recognise place value up to 50.

Represent some amounts up to 50 in different ways. Can you use objects? How many hands? What would the numicon look like?

FRIDAY – I can solve a problem involving place value.

Mrs Buck was thinking of a number rule. She asked the class to choose numbers to test so they could try to work out what the rule was.

If the number they chose fitted his rule, she wrote it on the board under 'I like these numbers'. If the number they chose didn't fit his rule, she wrote it under 'I don't like these numbers'.
