During his visit, he wished the Y6s luck and motivated them to do their best in their SATs. He also hosted a 20-minute workout with primary pupils and a select group of senior students and a Q&A session.



The importance of raising awareness of anxiety and mental health was highlighted during Mental Health Awareness Week. Pupils and staff across the school thought about ways in which they can help themselves, and each other, if they are feeling anxious. It was also great to see so many people showing their support by wearing their green ribbons and primary pupils and staff participating in workshops.

This time of the year for schools has seen pupils across the Key stages taking tests. The first being Year 6 who took their statutory KS2 tests. This led into the Year 2 KS1 tests and now the Year 11 GCSE exams. The pupils across the school have been demonstrating a positive attitude and great resilience to do their best and apply their knowledge. I have been so impressed with how both groups of pupils have approached these - a time that can be very scary but one which sees resilience, support, and ambition. They have supported each other immensely, whether that be a handshake, a good luck, or a fist pump. There is a sense of togetherness when we all understand the pressures that we and others may face. I want to take this opportunity to wish every one of our Year 11 pupils, the very best for the exams - they have been and will continue to be amazing!

Get ready for the future you want.

This half-term, Career Education went BIGGER AND BETTER, and we focused on "learning outside of the classroom", where students had the opportunity to increase their knowledge of Higher Education, work placements and what programmes are the best for them.

We started this half-term with our Year 8 pupils visiting the University of Portsmouth to understand what it is like to live as a university student. They discovered university costs and student budgeting, they had a chance to hear from a current university student and ask them questions and finally, a campus tour to see the similarities and differences between school and university.

Then, our amazing Year 9s participated in a project with the University of Portsmouth to celebrate 125 years of Portsmouth. We passed to the second stage of this programme, and they had to go to Fratton Park to present their business ideas to the manager, the university representative and to the other schools in the area. They did extremely well, and they even met the Head Coach of Portsmouth Football Club.

Plus, our Year 9 pupils had a wonderful meet national opportunity to 20 and local employers where thev practised their soft skills, exchanged ideas, broadened their connections, and discovered opportunities new regarding the labour market in the area.

Law is a very popular choice here at Mayfield, so we organised a trip to one of the most prestigious Law firms in the country (LEWIS SILKIN Law Firm) and our Year 10 pupils had the opportunity to go to Oxford and experience for themselves what it is like to be and work as a lawyer.

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Our Year 10s had an amazing day at the University of Oxford in Somerville College where we were provided with exposure to a wide range of activities. They had a tour of the college, the city, and a historical museum.

This year was the first time that KS3 went to celebrate the Creative Forces Day at the University of Portsmouth where they had the opportunity to explore their identities as young service child and how this impacts their education and relationships. They also had the opportunity to be introduced to potential future university options through immersive subject activities aimed at acquiring new knowledge and skills.

Next half-term, pupils will have the opportunity to explore their educational pathway, learn about the labour market and they will attend some trips to our local colleges and universities. Our Year 1 pupils have had another fantastic half-term, launched by our incredible trip to Marwell Zoo.

Our writing this half term has all been focused on animals and supported by our trip. First, we wrote poems about the animals that we saw at Marwell. The children thought about which were their favourites and what they looked like. Then after reading a book called 'There's an Orang-tan in My Bedroom', we wrote setting descriptions of the rainforest and ocean. The children have been trying extremely hard to think about how they can make their sentences more interesting by using ambitious vocabulary and we've been challenging them to use tricky words such as cascading.

Within Maths, we've completed units on multiplication, division and measure. We've continued to increase our use of the outside area to solve practical problems related to our mathematical learning. And when the weather hasn't been good, we haven't let that stop our practical activities and we've completed them in the classroom instead. Is that pen on the tables I spot? Shhh, don't tell anyone! We also had a look at fractions.

Science linked well with our animal theme, as we all learnt about different animal groups and what they eat. We even got to go on a bug hunt, with microscopes to look at things in detail, and found many mini-beasts.



This then moved us to think about where the animals live, and we placed them onto an atlas to help us see where hot and cold places are.

To finish off our animal-themed half-term, we created our own animal collages, which we hope you managed to see during our gallery session.

In other news, we hope you're enjoying seeing how we are developing the Year 1 area. So far, we've increased our outside playtime resources, which the children have been thoroughly enjoying and we have new additions to our family - plants! We hope to be able to continue this development by finding some shrubs that we can plant next to the fences. If you have any, please feel free to send them our way.

Thank you for all of your continuous support, we are looking forward to being able to spend more time outside during our last half-term unit on plants.

The Summer term kicked off in Year 3 very well, even if it started a little wet and windy! The children have all worked extremely hard and enjoyed their learning.

The children had a visit from a reallife Roman this half-term. We had a wonderful day where the children had the opportunity to participate in a drama workshop, build an aqueduct from just paper and even try on Roman armour. It was wonderful to the children all dressed up, having fun and learning loads too.

In Maths this half term, the children have shown amazing resilience and continued to tackle fraction problems. Year 3 has also solved problems around learning about money and using time.

In our writing, this half term, we have written historical stories about the Romans and Celts. The children have been learning about using speech in their work and applying this to their amazing stories.

In Design and Technology this halfterm, we have been looking at pop-up books. We have looked at various ways to make them and made prototypes. It is amazing what you can do with two sheets of paper!

Year 4 has had a great half-term, enjoying the sunshine and preparing for the summer to arrive. In topic lessons, we have continued our study of Egyptian history, learning about the role of the river Nile, how the Egyptian kingdom changed and how it eventually collapsed. The children then began their topic on rivers and enjoyed looking at the river Nile from the point of view of geography as well as history. They have continued to study how rivers are formed and the names of the various features we can identify from photos. We are looking forward to then making links between our learning and the river walks we undertook during our Minstead residential trip.

In writing, we started the half-term by writing a narrative with a focus on other cultures - using our knowledge of ancient Egypt and Rome to make links between our lives and the lives of people in ancient times. It was great to see the children explore their history learning in their writing. We then moved on to diary writing and applying all the

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fantastic grammar skills we have been working on all half-term. The children got to watch Charlie and the Chocolate Factory before writing a diary entry as if one of the children were given a tour by Willy Wonka.

In maths, we have really enjoyed learning about decimals in great depth, exploring the links between fractions, decimals, and money. It has been great to see the children develop their knowledge and link it to our wider number system. We have enjoyed using Dienes Blocks to represent numbers, helping us to reason about maths and how we can recognise decimals and convert them to fractions. As a whole year group, we have been working very hard to prepare for the Year 4 multiplication check, enjoying using tablets and laptops to practice our tests and applying their knowledge in their maths lessons.

Finally in art, the children have been practising their skills in the style of local artist Lizzie Cornelius. They have loved exploring areas of Portsmouth local to them, sketching and then adding blocks of colour, complementing each other to stand out. We have also been exploring the idea of artistic license and how it can be used to develop individual pieces that represent our great city.

In Geography, we have been studying rivers and the water cycle. We had the opportunity to go on a local fieldwork trip, following a river as it made its way from the source to the mouth. We have been enjoying our art topic on Friday afternoons. It is great to spend the last few hours of the week being creative. In our topic, we have studied the artist, William Turner. We have learnt about colour mixing, perspectives and how to paint effectively with watercolours. At the end of the topic, we used watercolours to create a piece of artwork in the style of Turner. As well as this, we have continued with the MyHappyMind programme. This half term, we have looked at the importance of active listening and how we relate to each other. We have also enjoyed taking part in the different activities for Mental Health Awareness Week, including sponsored steps, well-being workshops and our non-school uniform day where we got the chance to wear lots of green.

Our Year 6 pupils have had an incredibly productive half-term.
