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Message from the Head



Dear Parents and Carers,

As I write to you for the last time this academic year, I would like to reflect on what a challenging, but exceptional year it has been. This has included an Ofsted visit within the first 8 weeks, a return of face-to-face parent and carer meetings, a reflective Remembrance Assembly where all pupils across the school came together, our memorable Year R nativity, the phenomenal Addam's Family performance, our first community carols around the tree, successful performances in Dance Live – including a 3rd place overall for our primary team, football successes across all phases, first place in the enterprise events, the King's coronation celebration, presentation events, the community spirit of the Summer Fayre, residential trips, and so much more.

It has been exciting to be able to see just how much our children

gain from these memorable experiences.

Most recently, we have had two exceptional sports days – one in Primary and one in seniors. These events have been incredibly successful and gave our young people many opportunities to participate in a variety of activities with their peers, working on their communication, resilience and providing them with the element

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of competition. It was commented by our senior staff that “Our Sports Days had the best atmosphere of any they can remember...” as staff and students enjoyed a day of healthy competition between the Houses.

Also, I would like to thank each member of staff who helped make both days run smoothly, providing encouragement to all pupils to ‘dig deep’ and do their absolute best. It was also great to see such great relationships between staff and the young people, particularly at the Mountbatten Centre which would have been a new experience for our year 7 pupils.



This half term it was a pleasure to meet our new children and their parents/carers in year R, 3 and 7 and share the journey that they will now take whilst being part of our Mayfield community. It was also exciting to see them all return during the citywide transition and enjoy the 2 days. The children made an excellent first impression– and they are now all aware of the school motto, Believe. Achieve. Succeed.

In seniors, it was great to interview the current year 10 pupils who were shortlisted for the role of head prefect. The standard was high and I was particularly impressed with their confidence, attitude and determination to contribute to the improvements of our school.

Also this half term, the Year 6 children enjoyed their residential and cinema trips and the year 10 Geography students had an amazing experience on a field trip. The year 10 students also had a great time at college and represented themselves and our school brilliantly. The feedback was incredibly positive from both Mayfield staff and staff from other schools and the college. The students were keen to feedback about their experience with lots

The presentation event was another great opportunity to recognise and celebrate the talents, skills and progress that our students have made, over the year. at our Senior Sports Day!

Message from the Head of Seniors



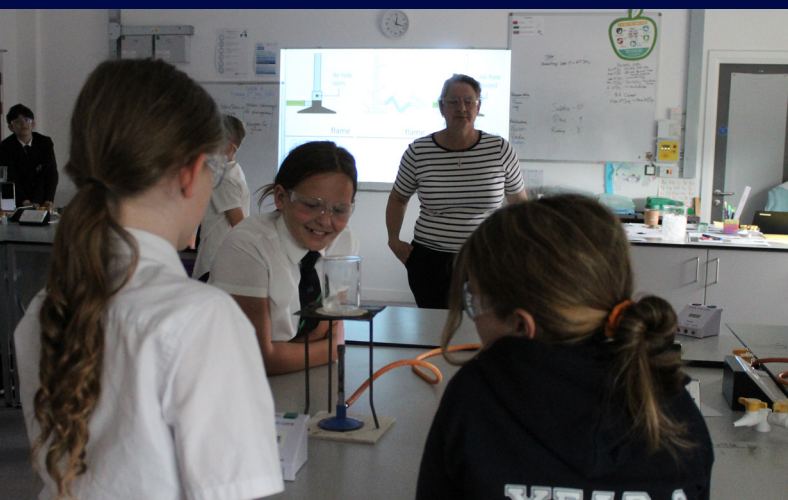
Another very busy half-term for all the Seniors - current and prospective!

Year 2

What a fantastic half term we have had in Year 2! The children enjoyed Sports Day, an author visit from Iona Rangeley, transition days, the Year 2 Performance and art week! Both Dolphins and Seals created a 'class flag' during art week using a range of materials to complete their designs and they were very proud of their masterpiece! The children have also been re-creating artwork in the style of Henri Rousseau and Pablo Picasso using sketching pencils and oil pastels for effect.

Our topic this half term has been 'Tragic Titanic' where we enjoyed a memorable trip to the SeaCity Museum in Southampton. The children thoroughly enjoyed the guided workshop and discovery session, in particular using their sense of smell to learn more about the different rooms on the Titanic! They also dressed up as different passengers and crew, experimented with water, steered the ship, and shovelled the coal. The children have applied this knowledge to our history and geography lessons this half term learning more about the Titanic voyage and the experiences of different classes of passengers.



In English, they have enjoyed planning and writing their own non-chronological report on an animal of their choice. We have been very impressed with their use of language and interesting facts! As part of our 'Tragic Titanic' topic, the children have also enjoyed writing diary entries from the perspective of passengers aboard the Titanic, focusing on how they would have felt during this time. The children have been reading 'Titanic Survivor' and applying a range of skills including comprehension, prediction, and drama.

In maths, the children have been learning about position and direction and measure. They have been finding length and height, mass, temperature, volume, and capacity using rulers, scales, and thermometers to estimate and measure different units. We have seen some brilliant Maths learning this half term!

We wish all our children and families a lovely summer!

Year 3



Year 3 have had a fantastic end to their year and have really enjoyed their topic called 'Light after Darkness'. In Science, they have been learning all about light and have discovered that light travels in straight lines and that dark is the absence of light. They have also looked at how light passes through objects and have used the terms opaque, translucent and transparent to describe this as well as learning about shadows and how they are formed. They have then used this knowledge, along with a text called 'Escape from Pompeii' to create shadow puppets to recreate the main characters and events from the story.

In English, we have been learning about some traditional tales and have been coming up with some alternative endings to some well-known stories. The results have been very imaginative!

In Maths, we have been looking at 2D and 3D shapes and have been learning to describe them by identifying right angles, horizontal, vertical,

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parallel and perpendicular lines. We have also been learning how to tell the time to the nearest 5 mins using analogue and digital clocks and some of us have even really confidently been able to tell the time to the nearest minute. If you get chance during the summer, please do keep getting your children to tell you what time it is to give them change to practise as much as possible.

We have also had some fantastic community visits this half term. The children really enjoyed going to the church to meet Reverend Sam and were fascinated by all of the special objects within St Nicholas' Church. Some of our children also went to a local care home as part of 'Thank You Day' to sing to some of our older community members. Both the children and the residents had an absolutely wonderful time. In both cases, all children showed exemplary behaviour and we were incredible proud of how well they represented our school.

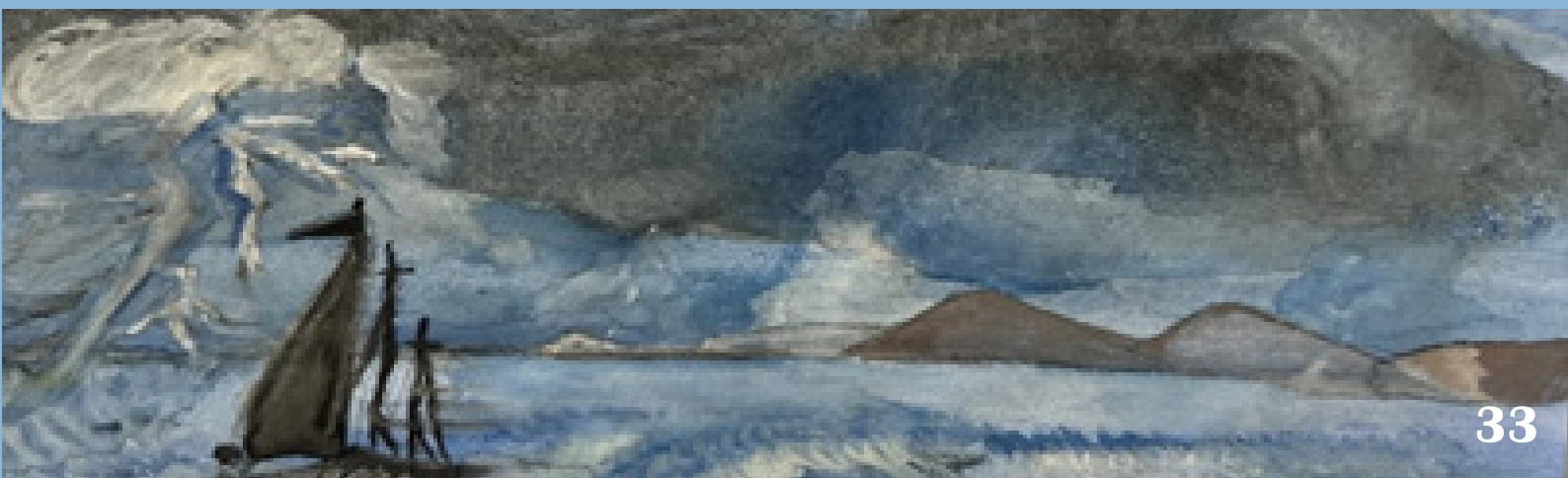
Year 4

The children in Year 4 have had a creative and exciting summer 2 term. It is hard to believe that we have come to the end of another academic year but what an amazing year we have had!

During the summer 2 term, in English, the children have been looking at descriptive language and poetry. 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We have enjoyed art this term and been very creative. At the start of the term, we created lighthouses using an old crisp tube and our imagination. During art week we worked as a team to design and create our class flags. All the children contributed to the wonderful, inspirational flags.

Year 5

Year 5 have really enjoyed our rivers topic this half term. We started the half term by visiting the River Wallington and tracking its journey from its source near Denmead to the river mouth in Fareham. The children really enjoyed making sketches of the river and linking it back to their learning when they studied a rivers' course back at school. The children have also really enjoyed recapping the water cycle and linking their learning to previous topics in Year 4. The children were also able to study the artist JM Turner and studied his work on landscapes. They then practiced sketching river views before applying their knowledge to watercolour images.

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In writing, the children studied the book Tuesday and wrote newspaper reports on the incident. They have also enjoyed reading the book Orphan's of the Tide and writing about the main characters in the story.

In Maths, the children have enjoyed looking at perimeter and area. They have investigated the links between the two units of measure using Cuisenaire rods and linking their knowledge to times tables, too.
