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## Message from the Head

At the end of my first half term as Headteacher of Mayfield, I reflected back upon the past weeks since the start of the new academic year in September 2022.

Over those first seven weeks, the events that we have held within school have demonstrated the importance of welcoming parents and carers on-site and meeting face-to-face. There is no doubt that being in-person is a better way to communicate and share the early successes and future improvements that we seek.

Events such as 'Meet the Tutor' for Year 7, our first Community Event, Year 11 and Primary Parents' and Carers' Evenings and our Open Evening have been just a few occasions when we have been able to share the journey that our school and our pupils/students are on. The parents and carers I spoke with during the Open Evening were very excited about the thought of joining Mayfield in September, which reflected the positive atmosphere throughout the school during the evening.

In addition to these, other opportunities have been held such as representing the school in sports tournaments (a very successful start to the year), auditions for Dance Live, going on school trips, inviting visitors to speak, Restart A Heart CPR sessions, and performing to an audience as part of the music BTEC.

During this half term, I invited a team of external reviewers from the Local Authority, a leader from another school and an external consultant responsible for curriculum and safeguarding, to support and challenge the school in our current position. Each member of the Review Team had undertaken a range of activities to gather evidence in a variety of areas/themes which included: Early Years, Reading, Mathematics, Geography, Behaviour and Attitudes. The findings confirmed the areas that we are working on and are included in our School Improvement Plan. As part of this, some parents and carers were also spoken to and the positive messages have been welcomed as has the feedback on how we can improve.

I would like to thank you all for welcoming me as the Headteacher of the school. It is a community which is great to be a part of and I am proud to be in the Mayfield family.

I continue to look forward to meeting and greeting as many of you as possible during future events and at the school gates. Your support in encouraging your/our children to be their best every day has been welcomed.

## Message from the Head of Primary

What an amazing start to the year it has been in primary! It was a huge privilege to be on the gate on the first day back to school in September seeing the smiling faces of the children as they returned from their summer break. clearly excited for the new term. In the seven weeks of this half term, they have achieved so much; everyone has settled fantastically into their new classes, got to know their new teachers, formed new bonds with children they hadn't been in classes with before and strengthen those with the children they knew well. Our new starters in Year R, Year 3 and a few others in different year groups have been welcomed and with help from their adults, have quickly become part of our Mayfield family.Our school councillors have been elected by each class so the children have representatives who will work to share their voices and have a say in matters which are important to them.

The new year has brought all sorts of new learning and opportunities for the children with topics including 'Our Journey', Seasides, Earth's Kitchen, Save the Rainforest!, To Boldly Go and Fight for Survival. Some year groups have been out on trips already or welcomed visitors into school. Some classes have already have the chance to share some of what they've done through their class assemblies, which have been amazing and so wellreceived. We are all looking forward to next half term's!In addition to what goes on in classrooms, this year has also brought us new playground space and more places to play. Children have enjoyed using the first of our newly purchased play equipment and have been learning in PE this week about different games they can play during break times and exploring even more equipment which will be available to them after half term.

When I've asked the children what they would like me to make sure I include in the newsletter to share with their parents, they have given such a wide and diverse list of things which just show the range of opportunities and the amount of positives we have had so far. ## Year 1

Year 1 have had a great start to the year! They came into school ready to learn and they have all engaged with our interesting and exciting lessons!

### What have we been learning in Maths?

In Maths, Year 1 have been becoming experts at numbers to 10! Within this, we have been learning how to identify 1 more and 1 less than a number, finding number bonds within 10 and also beginning to add! The children have been super resourceful and used number lines, diennes, counting objects and even pasta! Take a look at our great Mathematicians!



## What have we been learning in English?

In English, we have been reading 'This is the bear' and have enjoyed learning how to re-write the story! We added actions to the story, to help us remember it, and we also used Role play, to help us to understand what it was like for the bear when he went to the rubbish dump! Within this, we have learned key skills including finger spaces, capital letters and full stops. The children have already made great progress with these skills, and their final stories are great!



## What have we been learning in our Topic lessons?

In topic, we have been learning about our 5 senses! This has been great fun, as we have enjoyed smelling new things, tasting different textures, exploring with our eyes and covering our eyes, listening to different sounds, and also feeling different textures.

## Year 2

We have based our learning around Seasides and have looked at features of Portsmouth and some important landmarks, explored stories with a seaside theme and secured our understanding of number. We have been thinking about different materials and their uses and this ended with an investigation to work out the most suitable picnic basket cover to keep Mr Grinling's lunch safe and dry on its journey from his cottage to the lighthouse where he works.

It was fantastic to see so many family members in for our recent Parent Event and it was definitely very competitive with the beach hut models!! There were so many amazing designs and the enjoyment of everyone in the classrooms was clear to see. ## Year 3

This half term, Year 3's Topic was called Earth's Kitchen. We have spent our Geography lessons exploring Chile, Italy and the UK and comparing the differences between them, starting with tasting food from each country. We have continued the food theme in our Design and Technology lessons where we have explored the ingredients that come from each country and used our ideas to design and make a soup recipe.

In Science, we have underpinned our learning by ensuring that we know all about how we keep healthy, including learning about balanced diets and human and animal skeletons.





Our English this half term has been based on a version of the Hansel and Gretel story by Michael Morpurgo. We have explored this text in detail in our 'Destination Reader' lessons and then have used ideas from this book in our writing. The children particularly enjoyed decorating gingerbread men which they then used as a basis for writing their own instructions. We also took a trip to Foxes Forest to help us describe the forest that Hansel and Gretel get lost in and this has allowed us to use the children's real life experience to generate adjectives and nouns.

## Year 4

This half term, Year 4's Topic was called Save the rainforest. We have had a very exciting time exploring and discovering the world's the rainforests. At the start of the year, we had Zoo Lab visit us. They brought in some amazing animals for us to see, touch and even hold. These included a giant snail, a tarantula, a gecko, a snake and even a scorpion that glowed in the dark!



Our English this half term has been based on a fantastic book called Manatee Baby. The children researched and found out about Manatees and produced some very informative non-chronological reports. We used our knowledge about the rainforest, from our geography lesson, to write persuasive arguments about saving our rainforests and thinking about the impact on our planet.

## Year 5

In Year 5, this half term's topic was called 'To Boldly Go'. The children explored a topic based on space and the role of women in society. We explored our Solar System, the planets, seasons and the day and night cycle. We then spent the day at the Winchester Science Centre where we went into the planetarium, created and tested rockets and explored the exhibits. In addition, we studied how women's roles have changed over time and the impact they have on modern day society. We finished the topic by linking biography writing to Black History Month and the impact of world-renowned people of colour.



In writing we studied the book Cosmic by Frank Cottrell-Boyce and wrote our own version of one of the chapters. We also studied biographies and wrote our own about Jacqueline Mayol who was the first European to break the sound barrier.

Finally, in maths we worked on our place value skills, addition and subtraction whilst also focusing on our fluency skills and applying known facts to different contexts.

## Year 6

Year 6 have had a fantastic start to the year! From learning about fossilised poo (coprolite) to sitting mock SATS, all the children have shown great resilience, determination and deserve a well-earned half-term break.

Our topic this half-term has been spent learning all about evolution and how we can use scientific evidence to make inferences about the past. The children had great fun studying the evolution of different species, and particularly enjoyed applying their knowledge of inheritance to create Mr Men & Little Miss offspring. In addition to their work in science, the children have learned about Earnest Shackleton's famous Antarctic expedition and how perseverance in even the toughest of times can help you prevail.



The children have enjoyed applying their knowledge of evolution by studying the work of Charles Darwin and his research in the Galapagos Islands. They have produced some fantastic reports on the many different species of animals found in these islands, and have been learning the art of persuasion to encourage tourism to some of the most exotic destinations on our planet.

We ask that you encourage your children to read daily, either on their own or to an adult, and to encourage them to complete their weekly homework to support their learning in school.
