Discuss word meanings, linking new meanings to those already known. To link what they have read with to their own experiences.	English - In Writing we are learning To comment on likes and dislikes of a story or text. Link what has been read or heard to their own experiences. Join two sentences using the conjunctions and, but, because. Write simple sentences adding an adverb to a verb.	In Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education we are learning To know how to make a healthy lifestyle choice. To know I can feel good about myself when I make healthy choices. To name some ways to help myself when I'm feeling poorly or frightened.
Mathematics - In Number we are learning Read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (-) and equals (=) signs. Add and subtract one-digit and two- digit numbers to 20. Solve one-step problems that involve addition, subtraction and missing number problems.	Mathematics - In Measurement we are learning To tell the time to o'clock and half past the hour on an analogue clock. To recognise the value of coins and apply this to knowledge of partitioning two digit numbers.	In Science we are learning To identify and describe the basic structure of a variety of common flowering plants, including trees. Identify and name common wild & garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees. Observe closely, talking about what is noticed. Ask simple questions using their prior knowledge.	In Relationships and Sex Education we are learning To recognise how being healthy helps me to feel happy. To know I can feel good about myself when I make healthy choices. To recognise I am special so I keep myself safe.
