In Physical Education we learning... Explore balance, stability and landing safely. Explore how the body moves differently when running at different speeds. Explore changing direction and dodging. Explore dribbling with hands and feet. Explore tracking and moving to stay with a partner. Explore sending and receiving with hands and feet to a partner.

In Art and Design and Design and Technology we are learning... Develop, model and communicate ideas through drawings and mock-ups with card and paper. Select and use tools, explaining their choices, to cut, shape and join paper and card. Use simple finishing techniques suitable for the product they are creating.

## Home School Learning...

Read daily in preparation to change your reading books on Tuesdays and Fridays. Practise reading your tricky words so that you can begin to recognise them quickly when reading.

#### In French we are learning...

To use everyday greetings in context. Know and join in with familiar French songs. Listen to the French spoken language. Begin to join in and respond to spoken language through songs and rhymes.

In Music we are learning... Recognise that different instruments are played in a piece of music and express feelings towards it. Know and be able to say whether they like or dislike a piece of music. Sing with a good sense of pulse as a group. Make different sounds with the voice. Follow instructions about when to play and sing.
