To enhance our understanding of using evidence from the text to explore the six reading skills areas: vocabulary, infer, predict, explain, retrieve and summarise.	English - In Writing we are learning To use figurative language and fronted adverbials to write an effective setting description for a desert. To use persuasive devices such as exaggeration and rhetorical questions to create a brochure advertising desert holidays. What punctuation to use to show speech.	In Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education we are learning To celebrate difference. To appreciate that everyone's family is different and equally as important. About bullying and how to respond to a situation to act on and prevent bullying.

To solve a range of problems applying knowledge of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.	Mathematics - In Measurement we are learning to use addition, subtraction, multiplication and division knowledge and apply it to measurements such as money and capacity.	In Science we are learning To identify different types of rocks. To classify different rocks based on their appearance, moving on to their scientific properties. To plan and carry out investigations to measure the durability and permeability of different types of rocks. About how fossils and soil is formed.	In Relationships and Sex Education we are learning About how to develop positive relationships with others. To recognise that words can be hurtful. To explore the relationships that make up families to understand that everybody's family is different and important to them.

In French we are learning... To understand and respond to familiar spoken words and phrases E.g. simple commands and questions. To build up our vocabulary knowledge for some colours, numbers to 10 and some Christmas nouns and use them in a simple sentence. To perform a Christmas song in French.

In Music we are learning...
To know that pitch and rhythm can be represented in different ways.
To extend our knowledge of musical notation as a more formal way of representing music. Recognising the notation for C, D, E, F, G, A, B and understanding what a minim and crotchet is.
To listen to music, respond, compose, sing and perform.
