## English - Our book study is...

## English - In Reading we are learning...

To retrieve facts and explore subject specific vocabulary through narrative, which will enrich our Geography knowledge, helping us to answer our big question.

To enhance our understanding of using evidence from the text to explore the six reading skills areas: vocabulary, infer, predict, explain, retrieve and summarise.

## English - In Writing we are learning...

To use figurative language and fronted adverbials to write an effective setting description for a desert.

To use the features of a non-fiction text to create a non-chronological report about deserts.

To use cohesive techniques to extend ideas and ensure the flow of a text.

## In Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education we are learning...

To celebrate difference.

To learn how to respond to conflict and how to act in situations which involve bullying.

To appreciate that everyone's family is different and important to them.

## Mathematics - In Number we are learning...

To add and subtract multiples of 10 and tens and ones crossing boundaries.

To recall and use multiplication and division facts for 3, 4 and 8.

To solve a range of problems applying knowledge of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

## Mathematics - In Measurement we are learning...

To use addition, subtraction, multiplication and division knowledge and apply it to measurements such as money and capacity.

## In Science we are learning...

To identify that humans and some other animals have skeletons and muscles for support, protection and movement.

To compare and sort invertebrates based on the structure of their body.

## In Relationships and Sex Education we are learning...

About how to develop positive relationships with others.

To recognise that words can be hurtful.

To explore the relationships that make up families and to understand that everybody's family is different and important to them.



## **In Religious Education, Beliefs and Values we are learning...**

To understand why festivals are so important to religious communities.

To make comparisons between different religious festivals.

To gather information for a debate discussing if the real meaning of a festival can be preserved or if material things take over.

## **In Geography we are learning...**

To name some significant deserts.

To know the features and locations of deserts across the world.

To describe the physical features of deserts, identifying ways deserts are used.

To consider the threats of deserts for humans and animals.

## **In Physical Education we are learning...**

To develop a range of ball skills such as tracking a ball, throwing techniques, catching skills using one/two hands and dribbling skills. The skills required to play the game of Hockey; including using a hockey stick when defending and attacking.

## **In French we are learning...**

To understand and respond to familiar spoken words and phrases  
E.g. simple commands and questions.  
To build up our vocabulary knowledge for some colours, numbers to 10 and some Christmas nouns and use them in a simple sentence.  
To perform a Christmas song in French.

## **In Computing we are learning...**

To add content to a desktop publishing publication.

To recognise how text and images convey information and how text and layout can be edited.

To create their own template and add content then edit text using font sizes and colour.

## **In History we are learning...**

About Remembrance Sunday, exploring the enquiry question 'Who do we remember?'

To use primary sources and their interpretations, some of which are from our local community, to learn about the people we remember during remembrance and how we remember them.

## **In Design Technology we are learning...**

To develop or textiles skills, including sewing.

To study Virgil Abloh and use ideas inspired by his work to create a festival decoration.

To use running stitch, blanket stitch and a cross stitch.

## **In Music we are learning...**

To consider what stories music tells us about the past?

To know the difference between crotchets and paired quavers.

To rehearse and learn to play the recorder as a solo or part of an ensemble

To recognise major and minor sounds.  
To listen to music, respond, compose, sing and perform.
