Our aims	Provide a purposeful, safe and caring environment in which to learn. Nurture self-belief in our children. Teach children to celebrate difference.	Work hard as a member of my class and school. Engage in school life and support the spirit and culture of my school.	 Talk to my/our child about their school day and encourage them to participate fully in school life. Participate in school life & learning ourselves where possible
safety	Provide an environment which has been risk assessed in response to the COVID-19 infection. Adhere to the social distancing rules as much as we reasonably can, both in and out of school. Provide a curriculum that meets the needs of each child's well-being, mental health and academic needs. Contact parents/carers if a child displays symptoms of COVID-19 Inform parents if staff or children in your child's year group tests positive of COVID-19 resulting in the need to self-isolate for at least 14 days. Communicate between home and school through notices, newsletters, text, email and the school website.	 Follow the social distancing rules in class and in the playground. Tell an adult if I feel unwell Not bring unneeded things into school, or take things home from school. Only use the equipment provided to me by school. Not mix with any other Bubble in the school. Only enter and exit the school building from the designated gate and doors. When coughing and sneezing use "Catch it", "Bin it" and "Kill it". Wash hands regularly— use soap and water for 20 seconds/ hand sanitiser. Show that I am Resourceful, Hopeful, Successful and Caring at all times to keep myself and others safe. Follow the safety rules at all times. 	 If my child, or anyone in my household, shows symptoms of COVID-19, I will not send them to school, we will self-isolate for 14 days as a family, I will get them tested and let the school know as soon as possible. Understand if my child is unwell at school, she/he will be immediately isolated from other children and sent home. When dropping my child off and picking them up, adhere to the 2 metre social distancing rules and be on time. Insure that only one parent/carer will drop off & pick up. My child will not bring any personal items with them. Remind my child about social distancing rules but accept they are difficult to follow. Remind my child of "Catch it", "Bin it" and "Kill it" for coughing and sneezing and teach hand washing. Not be allowed into the school without an unavoidable pre- arranged appointment. Support all staff in their efforts to be 'as safe as possible' environment understanding all are doing their best. Read all letters/messages/emails that are sent home. Provide up to date emergency contacts details. Do not use or walk with children in the staff car parks.
ur work	Provide an exciting and stimulating curriculum to prepare children for the next steps in their lives. Support your child with aspirational and appropriate expectations of attainment. Celebrate your child's academic and personal achievements.	Learn as well as I can. Recognise that I will get more from school, the more I take part. Take part in home learning and share my reading, spelling and mental arithmetic skills with my parents/carers.	 Support my/our child with their work and encourage them to try their best. Support Home Learning activities and encourage my/our child develop and practice their skills. Encourage them to be an active participant in school. Support school in celebrating my/our child's academic & personal achievement.
e / School link:	Inform you of any significant matters concerning your child in a timely and sensitive manner. Provide an annual written report about your child & hold two Parent/Carer evenings per year. Hold regular parent events so you can see your child's learning in context. Provide information to you about our school including policies, workshops, activities and newsletters.	Help my parents/carers to feel part of the school by talking to them about my day. Ensure that all letters sent out by school are given to my parent/carers. Share my learning with my parents during parent events. Be at school as much as possible and arrive on time.	Work in partnership with the school. Raise concerns about my child in a timely and sensitive manner. Attend parent/carer evenings, when this is not possible, arrange an alternative meeting. Respond to school letters and texts timely. Attend parent/carer meetings and provide feedback to help shape school life. Attend school workshops where possible so I can support my child with their learning. Provide school with up to date contact details. Help your child to attend school and be on time not taking holidays / leave in term time.
Our Learning when at home	Provide learning linked to your child's next steps if they learn at home whilst: Awaiting the outcome of a test Are self-isolating as someone in their house has a positive test. Their Bubble is closed. Work and feedback will be shared via the Class Dojo system from 1st day. Not expect a child to complete work if they are unwell.	If I am not unwell I will compete my learning when at home to the best of my ability. I will ask for help if I need it. I will talk with someone if I am worried as most problems can be easily sorted out. I will stay physically active so that I can stay healthy both in body and mind.	 Support my child in completing all home learning to the best of their ability. Contact with your teacher via the Class Dojo system. Organise the learning day into a routine-following the time table provided in the remote learning brochure. Build in time for wider lifelong learning experiences alongside those provided – e.g. cooking, gardening. Build in time for your child to be active and stay physically healthy.
