Year Six joined in the Young Voices event at the AO arena on Tuesday. They have enjoyed learning the songs and shared them with their parents in school last night. On Monday, Year 4 travelled to Liverpool Museum to immerse themselves in the world of the Ancient Greeks. Year three have recently led on our Number Day for the NSPCC, their chosen charity for this year, which raised an amazing £880. Our Foundations Stage children have been eagle-eyed for the RSBP Big Garden birdwatch and Year five have enjoyed a visit to Weaver Hall museum. These are just some of the extended learning opportunities that have taken place.

Other opportunities which our children have enjoyed over the past few weeks will continue after the February break. Stockport County football club's education department have been coming into school weekly to further develop children's love of sport. This has been added to by The Kingsway School's Transition team who have been working with our Year Six on transition support, through sport. The children are learning to play Lacrosse whilst breaking down worries or concerns about moving to secondary school.

Charity event

Year 1 will be leading our next fund raising charity event, across school on Wednesday 28th February 2024. This will be a Break the Rules Day for Turner Syndrome. Children will be allowed to break school rules in exchange for a donation!

We have agreed on five rules that children can break if they choose with a 50p donation to break one rule, £1 donation to break two rules and if they wish to break all five of the rules we ask for a £2 donation.

The five rules that are breakable on the 28th February are:

- 1. School jumpers must be worn
- 2. School shoes must be worn
- 3. No juice in water bottles
- 4. No nail varnish
- 5. Only blue hair accessories

School time appointments

It is important that parents remember that children must not be removed from lessons during the school day for doctors, dentist or other appointments and all appointments must be made outside of the school day or during holidays. Parents should never make appointments that prevent children from being in school between 8.55am and 3.20pm. In addition, it is not acceptable to ask for children to leave school for parental appointments or to ask that children be allowed to leave school early with siblings. The number of parents making school time appointments is a growing concern at Meadowbank which we really need to stop so







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that we can have our children in learning each school day. Please ask for appointments to be outside of school hours, we have always found that this request is always understood and supported by medical practitioners.

Enjoy the next week's holiday, however you plan to spend it and we will see you back in school on Monday 19th February.
