
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Thank you to our Friends of Meadowbank Parent Group

Leading Parent Partnership Award - LPPA Award

Our school led verification visit has now been confirmed for Thursday 20th June. Miss Carrington, Mrs Ball and the LPPA working party, would like to thank all of our families for their ongoing support, involvement in school events and commitment in working towards meeting the key performance indicators. We hope this enables us to reflect on current practice, further strengthen our school partnership with parents and celebrate our successes. We will be sharing the Leading Parent Partnership Award survey with you again on Monday 10th June and look forward to reading your responses.

Our Year six children took part in the national end of Key Stage Two Assessments, their SATS last week. We were all so proud of their positive attitude and commitment to give their best in each task. The tests are just one measure of academic progress, they do not highlight the wealth of other strengths and talents that each of our children have and we could not be happier with how they approached the week together, as a team. Well done everyone!

There are other national assessments taking place over the next few weeks, our Year two children are working though their end of Key Stage One Assessments. Although these are no longer statutory or reportable, we will continue to use them as part of our internal assessments. Similarly, our Year one children will take part in their phonics assessments as we return from the Whit break and Year four will be assessed on their multiplication tables knowledge. What very busy children!

New rules concerning children being absence from school have been introduced by the government.

The aim of the new rules is to reduce the number of days missed by children due to unauthorised absence, especially for unauthorised term time holidays. These rules come into force on 19th August 2024 and will therefore take effect from the start of the 2024-25 school year. They will apply only to offences taking place (and fines issued) from then onwards. The new rules are:

- For the first fine issued for after the start of the 24-25 school year, the fine will increase to £80 per parent per child if paid within 21 days, or £160 if paid within 28 days.
- If a second fine is then issued to the same parent, for the same child, within three years of the first fine. it will be for £160.
- Subsequent offences no further fines can then be issued if two have already been issued to the same parent, for the same child, within the previous three years (starting with the date of the first fine); instead the parent will be prosecuted by the Local Authority in the Magistrates' Court.

We are only able to authorise leave of absence if we are satisfied that there are exceptional circumstances. This is extremely rare and will never be the case for family holidays, given that 13 weeks of school holidays are available to families each year.

Congratulations to all of our children who have been in school on time every day this half term. Our whole school attendance is 95.3% which is above the National Average and an increase from last term. It is important to keep this up as we approach the end of the school year. Being in school is important to your child's academic achievement, wellbeing, and wider development. If you have any concerns please contact your child's class teacher as we want to support all children to have good school attendance.

Our new lunchtime catering provider begins work with school after the holidays. You can now order meals from home with your child and our kitchen is being refurbished during the break to ensure that we have exemplary school meal provision.

Enjoy the two-week break and let's hope for lots of sun and fresh air. We will see you back in school on Monday 10th June. Just a few reminders about the start and end of day systems. Please do not arrive earlier than the gates open, put phones away whilst on school grounds and ensure that your children are not on bikes and scooters after they pass through the gates. Can I also make a plea that families park courteously and do not block the driveways of our neighbours. Thank you for your support in making our school a safe and happy one.
