COMMUNICATION FROM SCHOOL


To enable school to communicate efficiently with parents, it is important that your device allows '**push notifications**'.

On iOS

When the Arbor App is downloaded you should receive a prompt to receive notifications from Arbor. Make sure that you select **Allow** to enable school to send push notifications. This will ensure you receive a notification when you have a new In-App message from school.

If you select **Don't Allow**, you can turn Push Notifications back on at any time by going to settings on your phone.

PUSH NOTIFICATIONS—IMPORTANT



Please could parents / carers make sure you have downloaded the Arbor app and have '**push notifications**' enabled as this is the way school will contact you regarding any school closures.

E.g. If the weather is bad and school is going to close.

Do you receive Free School Meal holiday vouchers?


They are £15 per child per week in school holidays and can be used for shopping in either Aldi or Iceland.

If you need any help to complete the form, please ask at the School Office.




World Book Day

"Reading for Pleasure"

This is to encourage a daily reading habit.

This year, we are asking children to come into school dressed as their favourite book character / hero. Attached is a guide to simple costume making should you need some inspiration. We are busy planning activities to help us enjoy our day. More details will be shared nearer the time.



Dressing Up Ideas for Parents



Some schools invite children to come to school in a costume for World Book Day because it's a fun way to encourage children (particularly reluctant readers) to engage with reading, to swap reading recommendations and to celebrate what they are reading at home.

Top tips for putting together a costume

- Choose a book your child is happy to talk about.
- Start with things you might already have – tracksuits, t-shirts (inside out to make them plain) and pyjamas make a good base for a costume.
- Focus on the parts of the character that make them stand out - use facepaint or simple props to show these.



What if I/my child....

...doesn't have a book to share?

Try a costume that invites recommendations – a t-shirt with post-it notes or one you don't mind being written on.

... doesn't like dressing up?

Keep it simple with a character who wears everyday clothes, by focussing on a prop, or by using a badge instead.

... likes non-fiction?

Focus on what they like – could they share a fact, or the subject matter, or do they want to focus on the author?

....aren't any good at crafting?

Stick to everyday clothes and add small details to focus on key elements of the character – hats, ears, sticking things on t-shirts etc.

ARE YOU ENTITLED TO FREE SCHOOL MEALS?

To see if you are eligible for Free School Meals with Rochdale Council, please visit www.rochdale.gov.uk/benefits-money/free-school-meals to complete the electronic form. You will get an immediate response and will not be required to fill out any further paperwork. Rochdale Council will process your application and they will send you a letter to inform you of the outcome. Please bring a copy of this letter to school and we can update your child's record. Please note any school meals taken will need to be paid for until eligibility is confirmed.

For every pupil registered under the criteria above, the school will receive an additional 'Pupil Premium' funding of £1450 per child which is spent on ensuring our children are supported to make the best possible progress in school. This is also used to access to facilities, clubs and subsidised trips.

We encourage as many families as possible to apply for free school meals so that we receive our maximum Pupil Premium funding.
