Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been wonderful to welcome so many EYFS, Year 1 and Year 6 pupils back in to school this week. We have all enjoyed being back together and would like to thank you all for your continued support and patience as we all learn how to be at school with these new measures in place. The children certainly seem to be having a wonderful time!

I have just received confirmation that, for the rest of term, class bubble sizes must stay at 15. We are currently using all our classrooms so this means that it is unlikely that we will be able to open school up to all pupils fully before September. I am extremely hopeful that class sizes will be back to their usual number in September.

We will be offering some transition sessions for ALL year groups, starting next week. These are only for the children **who are not** in school, to ensure we don't mix bubbles. Children who are already at school, in a bubble, will be given transition opportunities in the school day. These will take place in the hall. Please see the plan below for more details. Children should enter through the front of school. Due to social distancing and current school rules, parents will not be able to enter with their children. The children will be organised in their house teams and will spend a short while with their friends, meeting their 'new' teacher. Please ensure that your child is picked up promptly from these sessions. Social distancing measures will be adhered to. Your child will also be sent home with their school report on these days. If you are unable to attend these sessions, your report will be sent to you.


