Phonics & Reading



What is phonics?

Phonics is one method of teaching children how to read and write.

Phonics is all about sounds. There are 44 sounds in the English language, which we put together to form words.

Some are represented by one letter, like 't', and some by two or more, like 'ck' in duck and 'air' in chair.

Children are taught the sounds first, then how to match them to letters, and finally how to use the letter sounds for reading and spelling.

Synthetic phonics refers to 'synthesising', or blending, the sounds to read words. It is based on the idea that children should sound out unknown words and not rely on their context.

Phonics & Reading

- Picture books at first- Lilac band.
- Phonic books x 2- directly linked to your child's phonic teaching.
- Terminology phoneme, diagraph, trigraph, sound buttons, ninja words.
- Bug Club- online reading and games.
- Phoneme book will be handed out for each stage of phonics that we teach – grapheme, picture, acti on and crisp sound.



Exploring/ Continuous

provision

- Free choice periods of time for learning through play and exploration covering all areas of the curr iculum.
- Indoor and outdoor.
- Indoor: A range of areas including mark making, maths, construction, role play, small world play, sand, water, creative, reading, dough.
- Outdoor: Including water play, mud kitchen, digging pit, gravel pit, sports equipment, climbing, bikes, mark making, construction, sand pit.
- We are out in all weathers. Children may get dirty.
 Important not to wear best clothes/coats and have spare.



Other sessions Funky Fingers - Fine motor and writing

 Active brain breaks – Dancing/gross motor movement to music/ breathing.
