Social Sciences – Prison Visit

On Thursday, over 20 year 12 Social Science students from both Melksham Oak and Devizes sixth forms had the exciting opportunity to visit Shepton Mallet Prison. During their visit, they took part in a fascinating tour where they explored the history of punishment and how its purpose has evolved over time. The students were particularly engaged by stories of the prison's most notorious inmates, including the infamous Kray twins, and they gained valuable first-hand insight into the realities of prison life. The day concluded with a highly competitive prison cell escape room challenge where, thankfully, all four student groups managed to escape within the hour!



This afternoon, year 12 Criminology students from both Melksham Oak and Devizes sixth forms took part in a Q&A session with Lord Bruce of Bennachie as part of the national *Learning with Lords* programme. Our students were excited to have the unique opportunity to speak with Lord Bruce about his career as both an MP and a peer in the House of Lords. They asked thoughtful and insightful questions about his role in the House of Lords and the UK's parliamentary law-making process. The session proved incredibly valuable, not only for their Criminology course, but also for deepening their understanding of the UK's political systems.

Attendance

Setting good attendance patterns from an early age will help your child throughout their life, and for every day that your child is absent or late it makes it more difficult for them to progress and achieve their full potential.

Our aim is for every child to be in school every day and on time. The majority of our community have

excellent attendance and we appreciate the work that goes into getting them into school on time every day. Every day really does matter with school attendance. The Department for Education research shows that a pupil who misses more days of school is likely to achieve lower grades in their GCSEs, for example a year 11 students with **100% attendance is twice as likely to achieve grade 5 in English and Maths** compared to a student with 90-95% attendance. Persistently absent pupils in secondary school, those with attendance

below 85% (which is 28.5 missed days of school a year) could earn £10,000 less at age 28 compared to pupils with near-perfect attendance. A small drop in attendance can really make a big difference.




