There have been loads of science experiments going on so far this term, from making motors, investigating the properties of ionic and covalent compounds, separating mixtures and even learning how we can safely handle radioactive sources via teacher demonstrations.







Safeguarding Awareness

The focus of this weeks safeguarding awareness is Knife Crime.

We know that Knife Crime can impact on everyone that is touched by it. We have done work on this at Melksham Oak including some curriculum intervention on a bigger scale last year with the police and health and wider agencies.

One of the most reputable resource bases is that provided by the Ben Kinsella Trust.

Ben was just 16 years old when he was stabbed to death in a horrific act of senseless violence on 29th June 2008. Ben had been out at a local pub to celebrate the end of his GCSEs with his friends. On their way home, he and his friends realised they were being followed by three older teenagers. Scared and worried, they decided to run home.

But the older teenagers chased after them. They were seeking revenge for an altercation in the club that had taken place earlier that evening. Ben and his friends had absolutely nothing to do with the altercations, but when the older boys caught up with Ben, in an entirely unprovoked attack, they stabbed him to death.

Ben was the 17th teenager to be killed in London that year.

As charity set up in his memory they have done amazing work on raising awareness and supporting communities.

Their mission is:

The Ben Kinsella Trust campaigns for action and justice for those affected by knife crime and educates young people so that they can make positive choices to stay safe.

Their vision is:

No family or community should suffer the loss of a life to knife crime.








Merits
