YEAR 11 AND 13 EXAMS

We have reviewed our support for students and for the duration of the examination period we are offering all Year 11 and 13 students:

- 3. A measured start to the exam process at 08.45

We would like all students to be in school by 08.30 so that we can register and process students smoothly without having to rush the process.

SAFETY: UPDATING ROUTINES

As I briefed parents last week, we are developing new routines for:

- New assembly point: for fire that is located at the furthest edge from the road now the MUGA. In the event of an
 emergency evacuation, we would then relocate over to the adjacent facility at the Football ground without having to cross
 where the emergency services would be accessing the site. This will be practiced in the coming week and come into
 effect from the practice session onwards.
- 2. **Lockdown routine**: students and staff will be briefed but no practice will happen until we know that students are fully understanding of the process and that they are not alarmed by this. **We will advise before we undertake this drill.**

PARKING @ MOCS

We know that parking to collect children is always busy and we are lucky to have a large car park. The entrance to the school is busy with the crossing being adjacent to the bus lane entry.

- Please do NOT park in the bus lane entry, or use this for entry or exit.
- Please do USE the car park to park safely and collect your child.
- Please AVOID USE of the disabled bays and the collection points for our most vulnerable students to access transport.
