Intent: We want our children to become enthusiastic Historians and aim to provide an engaging and creative curriculum through which children will gain the research skills and chronological knowledge needed to develop their understanding of the world and their place in it.

At Mereside we follow the UK National Curriculum in KS1 and KS2. This helps our children to gain a coherent knowledge and understanding of Britain's past and that of the wider world. All pupils have weekly access to discrete History lessons, where they are able to learn how to ask perceptive questions, think critically, weigh evidence, sift arguments, and develop perspective and judgement. History helps pupils to understand the complexity of people's lives, the process of change, the diversity of societies and relationships between different groups, as well as their own identity and the challenges of their time. All pupils, regardless of gender or ability, are able to access the History curriculum.
