


Whole School Awards Ceremony

#### Leafcutter Bee Class



🐝 The Mighty Role of Bees in Our World

Bees might be small, but they play an absolutely colossal part in keeping nature and even our dinner plates—thriving. Here's why they're so important:

擦 <u>Pollination Powerhouses:</u> Bees are expert pollinators, meaning they help plants reproduce by transferring pollen between flowers. This process is vital for fruits, vegetables and countless crops we rely on every day. In fact, one in every three bites of food we eat depends on pollination!

🌿 <u>Biodiversity Builders:</u> Because bees pollinate such a wide variety of plants, they support entire ecosystems. Wildflowers, trees and other vegetation depend on them, which in turn provide food and shelter for countless animals.

Honey and Beyond: Bees give us honey, beeswax and other useful products but their true magic goes way beyond the hive. Their work keeps food chains intact and farms flourishing.


🔁 Environmental Factors: Bees are incredibly sensitive to changes in the environment. When bee populations decline, it's often a signal that something is wrong—like pollution, habitat loss, or pesticide overuse. Protecting them protects the wider environment too.
