# Put to the test by **Commando Joe**



Mereside children put their teamwork skills to the test when they received a visit from a military-style instruc-tor from Commando Joe's.

tor from Commando Joe's. Former army man Ro-mano Betts paid a visit to Mereside Primary School, on Langdale Road, to teach the children character-building exercises and the importance of R.E.S.P.E.C.T - resilience, empathy, self-awareness, positivity, excellence, com-nunication and teamwork.

positivity, excellence, com-munication and teamwork. Children split up into teams and took part in obsta-cle courses as part of the day-long training programme, which was won by the school in an online competition.

Romano said: "It was a showcase of some of the things we do with a view to building teamwork skills and resil-ience. It isn't like a military boot camp.

ience. It isn't like a mili bootcamp. "The children learned about team-work, confidence huilding and putting their trust in one and chasroom set-ting with children they might not usu-ally work with.

ally work with. "Communication, team-work and trust is key to what we teach, and I think that's what they took away. "Ithought they were fantas-tic, really engaged, polite and

well-mannered." Mereside Primary School teacher Lauren Richardson said: "The whole school took part. They all got a taste of teamwork from Commando Joe's. "The achilden
