What is Pupil Premium?

Pupil Premium Grant provides funding for two separate policies:

- raising the attainment of disadvantaged pupils of all abilities to reach their potential
- supporting children and young people with parents in the regular armed forces

Funding for 2020-2021

In the 2020-2021 financial year, pupil premium funding will be:

- £1,345 for each primary-aged pupil eligible for Free School Meals
- £2,345 for each Looked After and Post Looked After Child

At Mereside Primary School, we use Pupil Premium funding effectively to support raising the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and closing the gap with their peers. We will use effective programmes of intervention in teaching and learning, pastoral support and through our enrichment and entitlement provision. Pupil standards are evaluated so funding can be devolved to enhance the provision for pupils with complex needs and multiple vulnerabilities both academically and emotionally in order to close the gap in progress and attainment.

Pupil Premium Reviews

As of January 2020, approximately 65% of our pupils are eligible for the Pupil Premium Grant and therefore continuous review and evaluation of how this funding is impacting on our pupils is important to us. We review and evaluate our previous years use and impact of Pupil Premium annually. With this, we then also consider what may be required for our pupils for the following year in line with our Academy Improvement Plan and Strategy for supporting outcomes for pupils from disadvantaged backgrounds.

Additional aims with our 2020/2021 plan includes

- To ensure there are robust systems for Child Protection and Safeguarding using CPOMs in order to support and protect our must vulnerable children particularly those who are in receipt of the funding.
- To narrow the gap in attainment of these pupils identified as pupil premium and those who are non-pupil premium in reading, writing and maths through first quality teaching, interventions and precision learning.
- Integrating and using our Post COVID Recovery plan as required to support catch up programmes and intervention strategies are identified as required and actions put in place to combat challenges to pupils learning.
- Enhance the learning experiences and opportunities across the school in order to overcome gaps in learning and ensure better than expected progress.
- Enhance expertise within school in order to meet the global needs of all children and overcome barriers to learning.
- Individual personal action plans with detailed individual interventions which include additional reading, speech and language, social skills, individual support, extra maths group teaching, self-esteem and self-awareness, feelings and friendship skills.
- Continues Professional Development for all staff, such as on sensory processing and new behaviour strategies.
- Enhance rigorous and supportive systems for behaviour management in order to support and nurture the most vulnerable children and families.
- Enhance parental engagement in the life of the school, targeting vulnerable and pupil premium families.
- Continue to develop links with appropriate outside agencies in order to meet the needs of children and families.
- Liaise and work in a coordinated way with the new SEND publication in order to meet the learning needs of the most vulnerable children and those in receipt of the funding.
- Enhance and develop the pastoral provisions in place in school in order to provide additional nurturing support for vulnerable children as well as those in receipt of the funding. ie counselling services.
- Widen pupils' experiences both in and outside of school in order to develop and nurture talents and life experiences.

How we will measure the impact of the pupil premium

Our school has a Pupil Premium Lead, Mrs Jane Walpole, who along with all the Senior Leadership Team will monitor and evaluate the impact of our Pupil Premium Funding on the achievement of our pupils.

Individual monitoring on a half termly basis, along with detailed case studies, for progress through pupil progress meetings, re planning of targets and next steps as necessary and adapting intervention programmes and precision learning. These will be put on to CPOMs and monitored by the Senior Leadership Team and SENDCo/Inclusion Lead and the Academy Council to evaluate the impact on attainment and progress.

Periodic reports will be produced for the Academy Council which will detail progress to date, evaluated data, impacts and further areas of improvements. These will allow for challenge and discussion for the Pupil Premium Lead and SLT on overall outcomes for our pupils that are eligible for the funding.
