Eligibility for 15 hour 2 year old funded place

2 Year old funded place

- For families in England with a 2 year old receiving some form of support
- 15 hours of free childcare or early education for 38 weeks
- Places available the term before your child turns 3 (January, April and September)

Am I eligible?

To take up to 15 hours of free early education for your two-year-old you must meet the eligibility criteria as follows:

Are you in receipt of

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Universal Credit - if you and your partner have a combined income from work of £15,400 or less a year, after tax
- tax credits and you have an income of £16,190 or less a year, before tax
- the guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- support through part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act
- the Working Tax Credit 4-week run on (the payment you get when you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

A child can also get free early education and childcare if any of the following apply:

- they're looked after by a local council
- they have a current statement of special education needs (SEN), health and care (EHC) plan
- they get disability living allowance
- they've left care under a special guardianship order, child arrangements order or adoption order

What isn't covered?

The 15 hours of free childcare/early education for two-year-olds is not intended to cover the costs of meals, other consumables (such as nappies or sun cream), additional hours or additional activities (such as trips). Providers may charge a fee for these additions. If you choose to pay for these it is an arrangement between you and the childcare provider. However, you must not be required to pay any fee as a condition of taking up a 15 hours place, and must be offered alternative options.

Eligibility for 30 hour 3 year old funded place

3 year old – 30 hours funded place

- For **working** families in England with 3 and 4 year old children
- 30 hours of free childcare or early education for 38 weeks per year

Am I eligible?

- You, and any partner, must each expect to earn (on average) at least £131 per week (equal to 16 hours at the National Minimum Living Wage).
- If you, or your, are on maternity, paternity or adoption leave, or you're unable to work because you are disabled or have caring responsibilities, you could still be eligible.
- You **can't** get 30 hours free childcare if **either** you, or your partner, each **individually** expect to earn £100,000 or more.
- To keep your 30 hours free childcare place you need to check your details are up to date every 3 months.

What isn't covered?

The 30 hours of free childcare/early education for three-year-olds is not intended to cover the costs of meals, other consumables (such as nappies or sun cream), additional hours or additional activities (such as trips). Providers may charge a fee for these additions. If you choose to pay for these it is an arrangement between you and the childcare provider. However, you must not be required to pay any fee as a condition of taking up a 15 hours place, and must be offered alternative options.
